Global Updates: Tensions Rise in West Asia




- **Iraq Update:** U.S. KC-135 refuelling plane crashes (6 personnel killed; U.S. military states no hostile fire involved).

- **Iran Update:** Explosion in Tehran during annual state rally; new Supreme Leader Mojtaba Khamenei reportedly injured.

- **Impact on India:** Thousands of Indian tourists and expats remain stranded across the Gulf region.

Student Note:
The Strait of Hormuz has been closed. This is a crucial global oil trade route, directly impacting fuel prices.

Trade Update: Navigating the Hormuz Chokepoint



The Success: Indian-flagged LPG carrier **Shivalik** successfully crossed the Strait.

The Cargo: 54,000 tonnes of LPG (equivalent to one full day of India's LPG imports).


The Risk: 24 other ships remain stranded upstream due to the conflict.

Definition Box


Dark Transits: When ships turn off their Automatic Identification System (AIS) tracking to avoid attacks. 17 ships recently used this to cross the strait.

Govt's Defense: The ₹57,381 Crore Shield



The Fund:

₹57,381 crore

officially allocated for a new **Economic Stabilisation Fund**.

The Purpose: To provide fiscal space against global headwinds and unanticipated supply chain disruptions.

The Promise: Finance Minister assures the **4.4% fiscal deficit** target for 2025-26 will still be strictly met.

National Updates: SC on Menstrual Leave



The Petition

- Demanded **mandatory paid menstrual leave** across India.
- Modeled after **international policies** in the **UK, China, and Japan.**



The SC's View

- **Declined** to mandate the leave; urged **voluntary employer policies** instead.
- **Reasoning:** Warned it could be a **'double-edged sword'** — forcing employers to provide leave might incentivize them to avoid hiring women, ultimately hurting female career prospects.




Bill Update: Redefining Identity

Centre introduces amendment to the Transgender Persons Act, 2019

Before / NALSA 2014

The landmark NALSA Judgment recognized the right to **self-perceived gender identity**.



Proposed Amendment

- Seeks to alter the definition of a transgender person.
- Reportedly **drops the right to self-perceived gender identity**, drawing pushback from activists.

Exam Focus: Always link Transgender Rights to the Supreme Court's 2014 NALSA Judgment.

West Bengal


CM Mamata Banerjee announces new development boards for ST, SC, and OBC communities (specifically: Munda, Kora, Dom, Kumbhakar).

Maharashtra

Introduces the strict **Freedom of Religion Bill, 2026** (Anti-Conversion Bill) with up to 10 years imprisonment for forcible conversion.

Kerala

High Court rules out a CBI probe into the Sabarimala temple gold misappropriation case, stating the State SIT probe is satisfactory.
