KERALA ANNOUNCES MENSTRUAL LEAVE

Kev Highlights:

Kerala Government announced menstrual leave for female students in all state universities under the Department of Higher Education as part of the government's "commitment to realize a gender-just society".

- A n girl of age 18 years and above is eligible to avail of 60 days of menstrual leave in a year.
- With this, the attendance percentage of girl students is sealed at 73% as against the usual 75%.

Practices Worldwide:

Menstrual leave policies are not uncommon in many countries around the world, including Japan, Indonesia, South Korea, Taiwan, and Italy.

- In Japan, menstrual leave has been in place since 1947, and female employees can take up to three days off per month for menstrual cramps.
- In Indonesia, female employees are entitled to two days of menstrual leave per month, while in South Korea, female employees can take one day of menstrual leave per month.
- Taiwan allows female employees to take three days of menstrual leave per year, while Italy has no set policy but allows female employees to take sick leave for menstrual-related issues.

Situation in India:

The issue of menstrual leave and menstrual hygiene in India has been a topic of discussion for several years.

- In 1992, Bihar became the first state to introduce period leave for working women. However, the stigma around menstruation remains a significant challenge in the country.
- The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare implemented the Menstrual Hygiene Scheme in 2011, which aimed to increase access to sanitary napkins for adolescent girls in rural areas. Despite the scheme's implementation, many girls and women in India still lack access to adequate menstrual hygiene products.
- The Menstruation Benefits Bill was first introduced in Parliament in 2017, which sought to provide paid menstrual leave to female employees in both the public and private sectors. In 2022, the bill was introduced in the Arunachal Pradesh Assembly but was eventually withdrawn as the subject was deemed unsuitable for discussion in the "holy" institution.
- The recent announcement by the Kerala government to grant menstrual leave for female students in all state universities under the Department of Higher Education is a significant step towards addressing the issue of menstrual hygiene and reducing the stigma around menstruation. However, the government must also negotiate the challenges that come with implementing such policies while ensuring that the goals of gender justice and equality are met.

World Health Organisation Commentary:

According to the World Health Organization, around 50% of adolescent girls in India lack adequate knowledge about menstrual hygiene management.

- Additionally, around 23% of girls drop out of school once they start menstruating due to a lack of proper facilities and support.
- The lack of menstrual hygiene products and facilities in schools and public spaces not only affects the health and wellbeing of women and girls but also their education and employment opportunities. It is crucial for the government to prioritize menstrual hygiene management and provide adequate facilities and support to ensure that women and girls can manage their periods with dignity and without hindering their daily lives.







Significance:

The decision by the Kerala Government to grant menstrual leave for female students is a step towards promoting gender equality and recognizing the unique challenges faced by women.



KEN-BETWA LINK PROJECT (KBLP)

Introduction:

- The Ken-Betwa River Interlinking Project (KBRIP) is a proposed project by the Government of India, aimed at linking the Ken River in Madhya Pradesh with the Betwa River in Uttar Pradesh.

SUPREME COURT'S ORDER ON ADVANCE MEDICAL DIRECTIVES AND PASSIVE EUTHANASIA

Introduction:

- The Supreme Court has removed "insurmountable obstacles" for the implementation of advance medical directives of terminally-ill patients to withdraw medical treatment and die with dignity.
- The order simplifies certain directions of an earlier Constitution Bench and allows passive euthanasia.
- The treating doctor and the hospital play central roles in implementing the order.

Advance Medical Directives:

- An advance medical directive (AMD) is a legal document that specifies the medical treatment one wishes to receive or not receive in case one becomes terminally ill and unable to communicate.
- The 2018 judgment required AMD to be signed by two independent witnesses and counter-signed by a Judicial Magistrate.
- The current order says AMD need to be signed by the executor/patient and independent witnesses in the presence of a notary or gazetted officer who would record his/her satisfaction that the AMD was voluntary and executed without coercion.
- Copies of the AMD would be handed over to the close relatives, the family physician, and a competent officer of the municipal corporation or panchayat concerned.
- The AMD, if the executor chooses, may be made part of the digital health records.

Process of Implementing AMD:

- The treating doctor at the hospital would ascertain the genuineness of the AMD, compare it with the copy in the digital health records, consult with the relatives about the option that withdrawal of care would be the "best choice".
- The hospital would then form a primary medical board with the treating doctor and two specialists who would verify the patient's condition within 48 hours.
- Then a secondary medical board would be constituted with the Chief Medical Officer of the district nominating the members. This board would again re-ascertain the patient's condition within 48 hours and give its findings on whether or not to withdraw medical care or life support.
- The hospital would then have to convey the findings of both the primary and secondary board along with the consent of the relatives to the Judicial Magistrate before giving effect to the AMD.
- In case, the boards refuse to give effect to the AMD, the person named in it or the treating doctor or the hospital could approach the High Court concerned.

Process without AMD:

- The treating doctor could inform the hospital, which would constitute a primary medical board.
- The board would meet with the patient's family or next friend or guardian and discuss consent. The meeting should be recorded in writing.
- Then the same course of action as followed in cases in which there is an AMD would follow.

Role of Hospital, Doctors, and Judiciary:

- The treating doctor and the hospital have to ascertain the genuineness of the AMD and the patient's condition.
- The medical boards would have to verify the patient's condition and decide on whether or not to withdraw medical care or life support.
- The Judicial Magistrate would have to be informed of the findings of the boards and the consent of the relatives before giving effect to the AMD.
- The Chief Justice of the High Court would constitute a Division Bench, which can set up an independent committee of expert medical doctors in case the boards refuse to give effect to the AMD.
- The order has been directed to be circulated to all the Health Secretaries, Registrar Generals of High Courts, and Chief Medical Officers in States and Union Territories.





History of Euthanasia in India:

- Euthanasia has been a topic of debate in India for several years, with arguments both for and against the practice.
- In 1994, the Indian Supreme Court passed a landmark judgment in the case of Aruna Shanbaug, a nurse who had been in a vegetative state for several years following a brutal sexual assault. The judgment of Aruna Shanbaug was delivered in the year 2011 by the Supreme Court of India. The court rejected the plea to allow active euthanasia for Shanbaug, but it did allow passive euthanasia in certain cases, under strict guidelines.
- In 2018, the Supreme Court of India passed another landmark judgment in the case of Common Cause v. Union of India, allowing passive euthanasia and the use of advance directives. The court held that the right to die with dignity is a fundamental right under the Constitution of India.
- The court set out guidelines for the implementation of advance directives, which were later simplified in the recent 2022 judgment.
- The history of euthanasia in India is still evolving, and there are ongoing debates and discussions on the issue.

Conclusion:

REPUBLIC DAY

Introduction:

India's Republic Day is a national holiday that is celebrated every year on January 26th. It marks the day when India's Constitution came into effect in 1950, marking the country's transition from a British colonial government to an independent republic. Republic Day is one of three national holidays celebrated in India, alongside Independence Day (August 15th) and Gandhi Jayanti (October 2nd).

History of Republic Day:

- After India gained independence from the British Raj on August 15th, 1947, the nation lacked a permanent constitution, and its laws were based on the colonial Government of India Act 1935, which had been altered.
- On August 29th, 1947, a motion was introduced calling for the formation of a Drafting Committee to design a permanent constitution, with Dr. B R Ambedkar as its chairman.
- The committee drafted a constitution and submitted it to the Constituent Assembly on November 4th, 1947. Before adopting the Constitution, the Assembly met for about 166 days in public sessions lasting 2 years, 11 months, and 18 days.
- After extensive deliberation and some amendments, the 308 members of the Constituent Assembly signed two handwritten versions of the document (one in Hindi and one in English) on January 24th, 1950.
- It went into force two days later, on January 26th, 1950, across the entire country. Dr. Rajendra Prasad began his first tenure as President of the Indian Union on that day. Under the new Constitution's transitional provisions, the Constituent Assembly became the Indian Parliament.

Celebrations of Republic Day:

- The main celebration is held in the national capital, New Delhi, at the Rajpath before the President of India.
- The day begins with a large parade that showcases India's cultural diversity and military might. The parade features floats from each of India's 28 states, along with performances by school children and the military's various branches.
- The President of India, as the head of state, hoists the national flag and gives a speech to the nation on the eve of Republic Day.
- The parade also includes displays of India's military strength, including tanks, missile systems, and fighter jets, as well as cultural performances by various groups.
- After the parade, awards and honors are presented to citizens who have made significant contributions to the country.
- Other cities and towns across India also hold their own parades and celebrations, often featuring similar displays of cultural diversity and military might.

Reasons for Choosing 26th January as Republic Day

- The Indian National Congress passed a resolution of "Purna Swaraj" or complete self-rule on December 19, 1929, at its Lahore session.
- The Congress party declared January 26, 1930, as "Independence Day" for the Indians, and Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru hoisted the tricolor on the banks of the Ravi river in Lahore.
- This day was celebrated as Poorna Swaraj day for the next 17 years.
- When the Constitution of India was adopted on November 26, 1949, it was decided to enforce the document on a day associated with national pride, which was January 26, and thus the Republic Day was born.

Significance of Republic Day:

- Republic Day celebrates the adoption of the Indian Constitution and the establishment of India as a sovereign, democratic republic.
- It represents the ideals of justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity enshrined in the Constitution, which is the supreme law of the land.

INDUS WATERS TREATY

Introduction:

- The Indus Water Treaty is a water-sharing agreement between India and Pakistan, signed on September 19, 1960.
- It was brokered by the World Bank, and it outlines the sharing of the waters of the Indus River system.
- The treaty is considered one of the most successful water-sharing agreements in the world, despite tensions between India and Pakistan.

- The notice was sent after Pakistan's "intransigence" in resolving disputes over the Kishanganga and Ratle hydropower projects in Jammu and Kashmir.

- In March 2022, the World Bank decided to resume the process of appointing a Neutral Expert and a Chairman for the Court of Arbitration.

India's notice to Pakistan:

- India's notice to Pakistan cites Pakistan's "intransigence" in resolving the disputes over the Kishanganga and Ratle
- India claims that Pakistan has contravened the graded mechanism of dispute settlement envisaged by Article IX of the
- India has sought a review and modification of the IWT to ensure a more effective and comprehensive mechanism for resolving disputes.
- India has also asked Pakistan to stop work on the Ratle hydropower project until the dispute is resolved.

Salient features of the treaty:

ADITYA L1 MISSION

Introduction:

Aditya Lı is India's first dedicated scientific mission to study the Sun.

The mission aims to put a satellite in orbit around the Lagrangian point L₁ of the Sun-Earth system. The satellite will observe the Sun's corona, the outermost part of its atmosphere, and the solar wind, a stream of charged particles emanating from the Sun.

Purpose:

- Aditya Li's main purpose is to study the Sun's corona, which is about a million times fainter than the Sun's surface.
- This makes it difficult to study from the Earth's surface due to atmospheric interference.
- The corona is also the origin of the solar wind, which affects the Earth's magnetosphere and can cause space weather events that impact communication and navigation systems on Earth.

Scientific Objectives:

The scientific objectives of the Aditya Lı mission are:

- Study the variability of the solar corona and its dynamics in various time scales, including the short-term variations associated with the eruptive phenomena on the Sun.
- Study the origin and acceleration of the solar wind and its magnetic field structure.











- Provide observations to help understand the dynamical processes of the transition region and chromosphere, and their
 role in the heating and acceleration of the solar corona.
- Provide near-real-time information about the space weather conditions in the Sun-Earth system.

Satellite Characteristics:

The Aditya L₁ satellite will have the following characteristics:

- It will be placed in orbit around the L1 Lagrangian point, which is about 1.5 million km from the Earth towards the Sun.
- The satellite will carry seven instruments to observe the Sun's corona, chromosphere, transition region, and heliosphere.
- The satellite will have a launch mass of around 400 kg and will be launched using the Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV).
- The satellite's mission duration is expected to be five years.

Significance:

Aditya Lı is significant for several reasons:

- It will be India's first dedicated scientific mission to study the Sun and will contribute to the country's space research capabilities.
- The mission will provide valuable scientific data on the Sun's corona, which will help improve our understanding of the Sun-Earth system and space weather.

History of Aditya L1

The Aditya-1 mission was intended to simply observe the sun's corona. In solar physics, the cause of Corona heating up to such high temperatures is still a mystery.

- The satellite was launched on the Aditya-1 mission into an 800 km low earth orbit.
- Later, ISRO intended to orbit the satellite around the Lagrangian Point in a halo (L1). 1.5 million km separate Earth from L1.
- The benefit of uninterrupted, continuous observation of the Sun is offered at this site.
- As a result, the mission was changed to the Aditya L₁ mission.

Timeline of the Mission

Aditya Li is India's first solar mission that will study the sun's corona and solar storms. The mission was first announced in 2008, and since then, it has undergone several phases of development.



PURSE SIENE FISHING

Introduction

On January 24, 2023, the Supreme Court allowed purse seine fishing outside the territorial waters of Tamil Nadu, imposing stringent conditions to regulate the extent of purse seine fishing outside the 12-nautical-mile limit off Tamil Nadu. The decision was made because the court believes that "everybody should survive."

Conditions for purse seine fishing outside territorial waters

The Supreme Court has allowed purse seine fishing only twice a week, on Monday and Thursday, between 8 am and 6 pm on the same day. The timings may vary due to sea conditions and weather, and the boats may return late, and docking time would cross the 8 pm mark. Only vessels registered under the marine fishing regulation law would be allowed to do purse seine fishing. Tracking devices should be installed in these boats, and the fishing crew must mandatorily carry identity cards.

Overview of Purse Seine Fishing:

Purse seine fishing is a method of fishing that uses a large net, called a purse seine, to encircle a school of fish. The net is then closed at the bottom, trapping the fish inside. The net is then hauled up onto the fishing vessel, and the fish are sorted and processed. This fishing method is commonly used for pelagic fish species, such as tuna, sardines, herring, and mackerel.

Types of Purse Seine Fishing:



Tamil Nadu's objection

Tamil Nadu had vehemently objected to purse seine fishing, even beyond the 12 nautical mile border. The State referred to a 1993 decision of the Supreme Court in State of Kerala versus Joseph Antony, which had upheld the ban on purse seine fishing beyond the territorial waters as it affected the livelihood of traditional fishermen. The mouth of purse seine net is one hectare and it would drag out anything and everything from the bowels of the sea. The livelihood of small fishermen operating within the territorial waters would be put at risk," the State argued.

Opposition to the judgement

One of the primary ecological arguments against purse seine nets is that they tend to draw not only the targeted fish but also at-risk varieties, including turtles. It is prohibited by Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Puducherry, Odisha, Dadra and Nagar Haveli, Daman and Diu and Andaman and Nicobar Islands in their respective territorial waters of up to 12 nautical miles. States like Gujarat, Andhra, Goa, Karnataka, West Bengal have not imposed any such ban on purse seine fishing.

Detailed judgment

The court has allowed purse seine fishing because it believes that "everybody should survive." Senior advocate Gopal Sankaranarayanan, for purse seine fishermen, had argued that there had not been any prohibition on purse seine fishermen operating beyond territorial waters for the past 30 years. The fishing season for south Tamil Nadu started two weeks ago and will go on for another four weeks. The season for north Tamil Nadu will start in two weeks, and some relief from the court was urgently needed.

The Fisheries Department of the Union government had recommended the lifting of the ban on purse seine fishing in a report submitted by an expert committee on November 15. The expert panel had refused to accept that purse seine fishing caused "serious resource depletion." It had recommended purse-seiners to fish territorial waters and the Indian Exclusive Indian Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) subject to certain conditions.

MAHATMA GANDHI NATIONAL RURAL EMPLOYMENT GUARANTEE **ACT (MGNREGA)**

Introduction

The Narendra Modi government has slashed the budget for the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) scheme to Rs 60,000 crore in 2023-24.

- This, after record outlays during 2020-21 to 2022-23, which also saw a significant step-up in employment under the scheme that guarantees a minimum 100 days of unskilled manual wage work in a financial year (April-March) to every rural household on demand.
- The Rs 60,000 crore provided for the programme, launched in February 2006 by the previous United Progressive Alliance (UPA) regime, would be the lowest since 2017-18.

About MGNREGA


- MGNREGA is a social welfare scheme launched by the **Indian government in 2005.**
- It aims to provide a legal guarantee of 100 days of wage employment in a financial year to every rural household whose adult members volunteer to do unskilled manual work.
- The scheme was renamed after Mahatma Gandhi in 2009 to commemorate his vision of rural development and employment generation.

Salient features of MGNREGA:

- It covers all rural households in India, and priority is given to the most vulnerable sections such as women, Scheduled Castes (SCs), Scheduled Tribes (STs), and persons with disabilities.
- The minimum wage rates are notified by the Central Government and revised annually.
- The scheme has a provision for unemployment allowance if employment is not provided within 15 days of registration.
- The works undertaken should be for creating durable assets and must be of public interest.
- The scheme has provisions for social audits and grievance redressal mechanisms to ensure transparency and accountability.
- The scheme provides a unique opportunity for rural development and employment generation, especially during periods of rural distress.

Impact of MGNREGA:

- MGNREGA has been instrumental in providing employment and wage security to millions of rural households across
- As of 2022-23, there are 15.4 crore active workers under the MGNREGA.













- The scheme has helped in reducing distress migration, and in many cases, it has improved the economic conditions of rural households.

MGNREGA mandates that wages must be paid according to the statutory minimum wages specified for agricultural laborers in the state under the Minimum Wages Act, 1948. This has helped in providing fair wages to rural workers and improving their standard of living.

Decentralized Planning:

MGNREGA has emphasized strengthening the process of decentralization by giving a significant role to Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs) in planning and implementing these works.

• The act mandates Gram sabhas to recommend the works that are to be undertaken, and at least 50% of the works must be executed by them. This has helped in improving the participation of the local community in the decision-making process, which has resulted in better implementation of the scheme.

Issues Associated with Implementation of MGNREGA

Delay and Insufficiency in Funds Dispersal:

Most states have failed to disburse wages within 15 days as mandated by MGNREGA. This has turned the scheme into a supply-based program and subsequently, workers had begun to lose interest in working under it. The delay in payment of wages is a consequence of insufficient funds, which has been acknowledged by the Ministry of Finance.

Caste-Based Segregation:

There were significant variations in delays by caste. While 46% of payments to SC (Scheduled Caste) workers and 37% for ST (Scheduled Tribes) workers were completed in the mandated seven-day period, it was a dismal 26% for non-SC/ST workers. The negative impact of caste-based segregation was felt acutely in poorer States such as Madhya Pradesh, Jharkhand, Odisha, and West Bengal.

Ineffective Role of PRI:

With very little autonomy, gram panchayats are not able to implement this act in an effective and efficient manner. There is a lack of technical expertise, financial resources, and administrative capacity at the local level, which has led to a delay in the implementation of projects.

Large Number of Incomplete Works:

There has been a delay in the completion of works under MGNREGA, and inspection of projects has been irregular. Also, there is an issue of quality of work and asset creation under MGNREGA. This has resulted in a large number of incomplete works, which has led to a wastage of resources.

Fabrication of Job Cards:

There are several issues related to the existence of fake job cards, the inclusion of fictitious names, missing entries, and delays in making entries in job cards. This has led to a lack of transparency in the implementation of the scheme and has resulted in corruption.





Challenges and Way Forward:


- The implementation of MGNREGA has been marred by various challenges such as delays in payment, corruption, inadequate monitoring, and poor quality of assets.
- The allocation of funds for the scheme has also been inadequate, and there have been concerns about the sustainability of the scheme in the long run.
- To address these challenges, there is a need for better convergence between MGNREGA and other rural development programs, effective monitoring and evaluation mechanisms, and greater involvement of local communities in the implementation of the scheme.
- The government should also consider increasing the allocation of funds for the scheme and revising the wage rates in line with inflation and local conditions.

LITHIUM DISCOVERY IN INDIA: OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES

Introduction:

Lithium is a rare and highly reactive metal that is widely used in various industries, especially in batteries for electric vehicles. With the global demand for electric vehicles (EVs) increasing rapidly, the need for lithium has also been growing at an unprecedented pace.

- In this context, the recent discovery of lithium reserves in India's Reasi district of Jammu and Kashmir (J&K) has opened up new opportunities for the country to become self-sufficient in this critical mineral.
- However, there are also some associated challenges and concerns related to the mining of lithium, especially in the ecologically fragile Himalayan region.

Lithium Reserves in India:

- According to recent reports, India has found 5.9 million tonnes of lithium reserves in the Reasi district of Jammu & Kashmir, which may be the seventh-largest deposit of the rare element, accounting for roughly 5.7% of all the reserves in the world.
- The lithium reserves in J&K are said to be of a higher grade 550 parts per million (ppm) against the average 220 ppm making them highly lucrative.
- It is noteworthy that this may not be the first discovery of lithium reserves in India, as around 1,600 tonnes of lithium reserves were found in Mandya, Karnataka, but there hasn't been any commercial supply of the metal from that site till
- Besides, the government is also running a Lithium exploration program in several other states, including Arunachal Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Jammu & Kashmir, and Rajasthan.

Uses of Lithium:

- Lithium is used in various industries, including ceramics, glasses, greases, pharmaceutical compounds, air conditioners, and aluminium production.
- However, its most significant use is in batteries due to its highest energy storage capacity per kilogram. Its high energy storage capacity combined with its extremely lightweight makes it a perfect choice for electric car makers like Tesla.
- Lithium is also used in the medical sector and in electronics that power our phones, solar panels, and other renewable technologies needed for the transition to clean energy.

Global Lithium Market:

- Currently, India is dependent on imports for its lithium requirements. In fiscal 2022, India imported lithium and lithium-ion worth almost ₹14,000 crores.
- However, the demand for lithium is likely to explode in the future, given the increasing adoption of EVs globally.
- With 50% of the deposits concentrated in three South American countries—Argentina, Bolivia, and Chile—the lithium triangle is where the majority of the world's lithium reserves are located.
- China, on the other hand, has an advantage over other nations and is in charge of 75% of the world's lithium refining.
- The proliferation of EVs could mean India becoming dependent on China. J&K's reserves, however, provide a major opening for India to be self-reliant.

Opportunities for India:

- The discovery of lithium reserves in India could usher in a new era not only for India but also for the world.
- With the demand for EVs increasing, the debate over global reserves of lithium has been gaining momentum. At the current rate of carbon emissions, the world will need at least 2 billion (200 crores) EVs, and according to the World Economic Forum (WEF), there could be a lithium shortage as soon as 2025.
- India's lithium reserves, therefore, provide a significant opportunity for the country to become self-sufficient and reduce its dependence on imports. Moreover, the local production of lithium could also create new job opportunities and boost the country's economy.

What are Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups or PVTGs?


- PVTGs are those that depend on hunting for food, have pre-agriculture level technologies, zero or negative population growth, and extremely low levels of literacy.
- The Central government began to identify the most vulnerable tribal groups as a separate category in 1975, establishing 52 such groups.
- The list was expanded in 1993, when another 23 groups were added, for a total of 75 PVTGs out of 705 Scheduled Tribes spread across 17 states and one Union Territory (UT) in the country (2011 census).

Importance of Focus on PVTGs

- Tribal population makes up for 8.6% of the total population in India.
- PVTGs are more vulnerable among the tribal groups.
- More developed and assertive tribal groups take a major chunk of the tribal development funds because of which PVTGs need more funds directed for their development.
- In 1973, the Dhebar Commission created Primitive Tribal Groups (PTGs) as a separate category, who are less developed among the tribal groups.
- In 2006, the Government of India renamed the PTGs as PVTGs.

Characteristics of PVTGs

- PVTGs have some basic characteristics they are mostly homogenous, with a small population, relatively physically isolated, absence of written language, relatively simple technology and a slower rate of change etc.
- Among the 75 listed PVTG's the highest number are found in Odisha.













Pradhan Mantri PVTG Development Mission

- The mission aims to improve the socio-economic conditions of PVTGs.
- It will saturate PVTG families and habitations with basic facilities such as safe housing, clean drinking water, and sanitation.
- The mission aims to provide improved access to education, health, nutrition, road, and telecom connectivity, and sustainable livelihood opportunities.

Conclusion

TURKEY AND SYRIA HIT BY DEVASTATING EARTHQUAKE

Introduction:

On February 6th, 2023, a powerful earthquake struck the border region between Turkey and Syria, causing widespread destruction and loss of life. The earthquake, which had a magnitude of 7.2, was one of the strongest to hit the region in recent years, and its impact has been felt across a wide area.

Causes of the Earthquake:

The earthquake was caused by the movement of the Anatolian plate, which is one of the most active tectonic plates in the world.

- The Anatolian plate is part of the larger Eurasian plate, which is constantly shifting and causing seismic activity in the
- The earthquake was also triggered by the presence of numerous faults in the area, including the Dead Sea Transform Fault, which runs through Syria and Jordan, and the East Anatolian Fault, which runs through eastern Turkey.

Tectonics in the Eastern Mediterranean Region:

The interactions between the African, Arabian, and Eurasian tectonic plates and the Anatolian tectonic block are the main tectonic forces in the Eastern Mediterranean region, which includes Turkey, Syria, and Jordan.

- Turkey is located on the Anatolian tectonic plate, which is bounded by the East Anatolian Fault (EAF) in the southeast and the North Anatolian Fault (NAF), which runs from west to east throughout the nation.
- The meeting of the Eurasian and Anatolian tectonic plates is believed to be "especially catastrophic," and it occurs at the NAF line.
- The Anatolia Block's translational motion toward Eurasia and Africa is largely accommodated by the NAF, a right-lateral strike-slip structure in northern Turkey.
- The EAF is the tectonic boundary between the Anatolian Plate and the northward-moving Arabian Plate. It runs 650 kilometers from eastern Turkey into the Mediterranean.
- In addition to these faults, the Aegean Sea Plate, which is submerged beneath southern Greece and western Turkey in the eastern Mediterranean Sea, also contributes to seismic activity in the area.
- Turkey and the neighbouring territories experience earthquakes mostly as a result of the intricate interactions between these plates and faults, which have led to a zone of high seismic activity.

Why Turkey is Prone to Earthquakes?

Turkey is particularly susceptible to earthquakes because of its placement on the Anatolian tectonic plate and its closeness to a number of significant faults.

- A third of Turkey is at high risk for earthquakes, including the areas around the main cities of Istanbul and Izmir and East Anatolia.
- Nearly 95 percent of Turkey's land mass is prone to earthquakes.
- Recent large earthquakes in Turkey have been attributed to the NAF, notably the 1999 earthquake in Izmit, which killed over 17,000 people, and the 2011 earthquake in Van, which killed around 600 people.
- The EAF is a substantial contributor to seismic activity and was the cause of the Bingöl earthquake in 1976, which claimed more than 3,000 lives.
- The destructive force of earthquakes, like the one that struck on February 6, 2023, is also influenced by their shallow depth.
- Because they release more energy close to the surface, shallow earthquakes are more likely to cause substantial damage.
- The risk of earthquakes to infrastructure and human life has also increased as Turkey's population and urbanisation have grown.

WINDFALL TAX

Introduction:

- Windfall taxes designed to tax the profits a company derives from an external, unprecedented event
- Governments levy a one-off tax retrospectively over and above the normal rates of tax on such profits
- One area where such taxes have routinely been discussed is oil markets, where price fluctuation leads to volatile or erratic profits for the industry
- Rationale for governments worldwide to introduce windfall taxes: redistribution of unexpected gains, funding social welfare schemes, and supplementary revenue stream for the government.

Reasons for levying Windfall Taxes:

- Prices of oil, gas, and coal have seen sharp increases since late last year and in the first two quarters of the current year, although they have reduced recently
- Pandemic recovery and supply issues resulting from the Russia-Ukraine conflict shore up energy demands, in turn driving up global prices
- The rising prices meant huge and record profits for energy companies while resulting in hefty gas and electricity bills for household bills in major and smaller economies
- The levies came as refiners made major gains by boosting fuel exports to countries that were in a deficit like Europe, which has now boycotted oil imports from Russia
- The U.N. chief urged all governments to tax these excessive profits "and use the funds to support the most vulnerable people through these difficult times."
- Calls to introduce windfall taxes found support in organizations like the IMF, which released an advice note as to how such a tax should be levied

Issues with Imposing Windfall Tax:

- Uncertainty in the Market: Windfall taxes are imposed retrospectively and are often influenced by unexpected events, they can brew uncertainty in the market about future taxes
- Populist in Nature: It is believed that such taxes are populist and politically opportune in the short term
- Reduces Future Investment: Introducing a temporary windfall profit tax reduces future investment because prospective investors will internalize the likelihood of potential taxes when making investment decisions
- Not Defined Precisely: It is not defined what exactly constitutes true windfall profits and how it can be determined what level of profit is normal or excessive











Who should be taxed? It is not defined who should be taxed - only the big companies responsible for the bulk of highpriced sales or smaller companies as well—raising the question of whether producers with revenues or profits below a certain threshold should be exempt.

SEALED COVER JURISPRUDENCE

Introduction

The Chief Justice of India D.Y. Chandrachud firmly refused the 'suggestions' offered by the government in a sealed cover on the formation of a proposed committee to enquire into the Hindenburg report on the Adani Group.

This signals the Supreme Court's acute awareness of how 'sealed cover jurisprudence' has begun to threaten the very credibility of the judicial institution.

About Sealed Cover Jurisprudence

Sealed Cover Jurisprudence (SCJ) refers to the practice of presenting sensitive or confidential information to a court or tribunal in a sealed envelope or cover.

It is used to ensure privacy, prevent interference with an ongoing investigation, and protect state affairs.

Historical Origins of Sealed Cover Jurisprudence

Service or administrative cases were the first to employ sealed cover jurisprudence. Service records and promotion assessments of individual personnel were received in sealed covers to avoid harm to the reputation of officers.

The court has also received confidential documents in sexual assault cases to protect the identity of survivors.

Legal Basis of Sealed Cover Jurisprudence

The Supreme Court derives its power to use sealed cover jurisprudence from Rule 7 of Order XIII of the Supreme Court Rules 2013 and Section 123 of the Indian Evidence Act of 1872.

- Rule 7 of Order XIII allows the Chief Justice or the court to direct that certain information be kept under a sealed cover or considers it of confidential nature.
- Section 123 of the Indian Evidence Act of 1872 protects official unpublished documents relating to state affairs.

Circumstances for Using Sealed Cover Jurisprudence

Sealed cover jurisprudence is used when information is connected to an ongoing investigation or involves personal or confidential information whose disclosure may result in violation of an individual's privacy or breach of trust.

The information can be kept confidential if its publication is not considered to be in the interest of the public.

Issues Related to Sealed Cover Jurisprudence

Lack of Transparency:

As the evidence or arguments offered in the sealed cover are not available to the public or other parties, sealed cover jurisprudence can reduce transparency and accountability in the legal process.

Disparate Access:

Because those who have access to the information included in the sealed cover may have an advantage over those who do not, the application of sealed cover jurisprudence might lead to an uneven playing field.

Limited Opportunity to Respond:

The parties who are not privy to the information included in the sealed cover could not have the chance to reply to or contest the facts or claims made therein, which can impair their capacity to properly argue their case.

Risk of Abuse:

Parties that want to hide material that isn't really confidential or who want to use it to get an unfair advantage in court might abuse sealed cover jurisprudence.

Interference with Fair Trial:

Because the parties might not have access to all the pertinent information or arguments that are taken into account throughout the decision-making process, the use of sealed cover jurisprudence can interfere with the right to a fair trial.

Arbitrary Nature:

Instead of being a standard procedure, sealed covers depend on the individual judges' need to support a position in a given case. This renders the exercise haphazard and random.









SC's Observations over Sealed Cover Jurisprudence

P. Gopalakrishnan vs The State of Kerala case (2019): The SC held that disclosure of documents to the accused is constitutionally mandated, even if the investigation is ongoing and documents may lead to a breakthrough in the investigation.

INX Media case (2019): The Supreme Court criticized the Delhi High Court for basing its decision to deny bail to a former Union Minister on documents submitted by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) in a sealed cover. It held the action as against the concept of fair trial.

VOSTRO ACCOUNTS AND HOW THEY FACILITATE TRADE

Last week, government officials informed that 20 Russian banks, including Rosbank, Tinkoff Bank, Centro Credit Bank and Credit Bank of Moscow have opened Special Rupee Vostro Accounts (SRVA) with partner banks in India.

All major domestic banks have listed their nodal officers to sort out issues faced by exporters under the arrangement.

About Vostro Accounts:

- A Vostro account is an account that one bank holds for another bank in the former's domestic currency. It is an integral offshoot of correspondent banking that facilitates wire transfer, conducts business transactions, accepts deposits, and gathers documents on behalf of the other bank.
- The term Vostro is derived from the Latin word "vostro" which means "yours" in English. In the banking context, the Vostro account is the bank account that belongs to another bank, and hence the name "your account."
- The Vostro account system has been in use for many years as an international banking mechanism that facilitates transactions between banks from different countries. Domestic banks use it to provide international banking services to their clients who have global banking needs. It helps domestic banks gain wider access to foreign financial markets and serve international clients without having to be physically present abroad.
- Vostro accounts are established based on an agreement between two banks, and the account is maintained by the domestic bank on behalf of the foreign bank. The foreign bank has no direct access to the account but relies on the domestic bank to conduct all transactions related to the account.
- The domestic bank that holds the Vostro account has the responsibility of ensuring that the account is managed in compliance with the rules and regulations of the country where the account is located. The bank must also ensure that the foreign bank is aware of any restrictions or limitations that may apply to the account.
- Vostro accounts are used for a variety of purposes, including facilitating international trade, settling payments, and providing access to foreign currency markets. They are also used by foreign banks to hold funds on behalf of their customers who are doing business in the country where the Vostro account is located.

Eligibility Criteria of Banks

- Banks from partner countries are required to approach an authorized domestic dealer bank for opening the SRVA.
- The domestic bank would then seek approval from the apex banking regulator providing details of the arrangement.
- The domestic banks must ensure that the correspondent bank is not from a country mentioned in the updated Financial Action Task Force (FATF) Public Statement on High Risk & Non-Co-operative jurisdictions.
- Financial parameters pertaining to the corresponding bank must be put forth for perusal.

Purpose of SRVA

- The framework could largely reduce the "net demand for foreign exchange, the U.S. dollar in particular, for the settlement of current account related trade flows".
- The framework would also reduce the need for holding foreign exchange reserves and dependence on foreign currencies, making the country less vulnerable to external shocks.
- Indian exporters could get advance payments in INR from overseas clients.
- In the long-term, promote INR as an international currency once the rupee settlement mechanism gains traction.













Comparison with existing system:

- The Special Rupee Vostro Account (SRVA) framework is an additional arrangement to the existing system that uses freely convertible currencies and works as a complimentary system. For perspective, freely convertible currencies refer to currencies permitted by rules and regulations of the concerned country to be converted to major reserve currencies (like U.S. dollar or pound sterling) and for which a fairly active market exists for dealings against major currencies. The existing systems thus require maintaining balances and position in such currencies.
- Under the existing system, Indian importers and exporters have to rely on foreign banks and correspondent banks for the settlement of their transactions, which is mainly dominated by the U.S. dollar as the vehicle currency. This necessitates the need for holding foreign exchange reserves and dependence on foreign currencies, making the country vulnerable to external shocks.
- On the other hand, the SRVA framework has the potential to largely reduce the "net demand for foreign exchange, the U.S. dollar in particular, for the settlement of current account related trade flows". The invoicing, exchange rate, and settlement of all exports and imports under this framework must be denominated and invoiced in Indian National Rupee (INR). This means that Indian importers and exporters can transact in their domestic currency, reducing their dependence on foreign currencies and making them less vulnerable to external shocks.

India has become the latest country to develop its own operating system (OS) in a bid to reduce its reliance on foreign software and enhance its digital sovereignty.

Dubbed BharOS, the OS, based on the Android Open-Source Project (AOSP), was built by the Indian Institute of Technology in Madras and funded by the Indian government.

Featuring stronger privacy safeguards, the OS will not have default apps installed, giving users more control and flexibility to choose the apps they want from third-party app stores, including private organisational app stores. Many referred to the Adani-Hindenburg Research affair as a 'Lehman moment'. The allegations by a self-confessed 'short seller', the US-based Hindenburg Research, of the Adani Group's "brazen stock manipulation and accounting fraud" continue to rattle the share prices of the conglomerate's companies. It has kept the investors, regulators, the government and the judiciary, engaged all this while.

The share prices of the Adani Group companies had jumped dramatically over the last two years, but few paid any attention. Mutual funds, strangely, ignored to even partake in this wealth creation opportunity. Top fund managers couldn't fathom why and how share prices of these companies were rising, touching astronomical valuations. But then, there was the country's biggest domestic institutional investor, the state-owned insurer LIC, which acquired shares in five Adani companies continuously over the last nine quarters till December 2022.

The jury is still out on whether the Adani-Hindenburg Research affair is a Lehman moment. In the classical sense, it is not. The broad-based markets in India didn't witness any pressure when Adani stocks tanked. The collapse of Adani is not a systemic risk, it doesn't bring down the Indian financial sector; even for LIC, the exposure to Adani is less than 1 per cent of its portfolio. Will there be more unravelling in this case? Nobody is sure.

"Another milestone for Project Cheetah. India has shown an example to the world by proving that an ecological wrong can be balanced by an action that is in ecological harmony," said environment minister Bhupinder Yadav, before releasing the cheetahs into their enclosures.

"The cheetah reintroduction into India is a bold step in terms of conservation and one that is desperately needed if we are to have any chance of saving this species from extinction," tweeted Road Transport and Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari.

Before the arrival of the felines, expert teams from Namibia and South Africa - the countries with the largest cheetah populations in the world - trained Indian forest officers and wildlife experts on handling, breeding, rehabilitation, medical treatment and conservation of the animals.



The Rajasthan government's proposed right to health bill has landed in deep controversy due to objections from the private healthcare sector, which is dishonouring as a part of the protests the provision of cashless treatment under existing state-run schemes. The bill has been in the pipeline for some months now. Private doctors and private medical institutions feel the bill will give extraordinary powers to designated government officials to enter their premises and harass them.

Very soon a new Indo-American robotic bird in the sky will accurately monitor Joshimath-like land slippage and landslide events across the Himalayas, help in saving lives. It is a unique satellite fine-tuned for day and night viewing and the big mission objective is to mitigate the risk of disasters.

India and America have jointly made a one of kind satellite that will image the Earth using RADARS like never before. Called the NASA-ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar satellite (NISAR), estimates suggest just the satellite costs over one billion dollars to make and is touted to be the most expensive earth imaging satellite ever to be made in the world. A 2017 statement by NASA said the whole 3-5 year mission will cost over \$ 1.5 billion.

In a first, the jointly made Indo-US satellite will be launched later this year from Sriharikota. In a big milestone event on February 1, 2023, the chairman of the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) Shri S Somanath will flag the departure of the massive instruments that will travel from the world-famous Jet Propulsion Laboratory at Pasadena to

On Thursday, a senior American defense official told Pentagon reporters that the U.S. has "very high confidence" that the object spotted over U.S. airspace in recent days was a Chinese high-altitude balloon and that it was flying over sensitive sites to collect information. One of the places the balloon was spotted was Montana, which is home to one of the nation's three nuclear missile silo fields at Malmstrom Air Force Base. The official spoke on condition of anonymity to discuss sensitive information.

A five-judge Constitution bench headed by Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul said the nine-judge bench constituted to decide the correctness of the Sabarimala judgment will also decide the practice of excommunication in the Dawoodi Bohra community. The bench also comprising Justices Abhay S Oka, Vikram Nath, JK Maheshwari had earlier heard the parties in the case who urged the court to wait for a nine-judge bench decision in the Sabarimala matter or refer the present case also to a nine-judge bench.

The nine-judge bench is seized of the Sabarimala case with respect to the entry of women into the Sabarimala hill shrine in Kerala. It is also considering three other cases involving women's rights with regard to religious practices.











During the hearing, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta appearing for Maharashtra had told the bench that this case should be tagged along with the Sabrimala case before the nine-judge bench.


The platform will be used to register and vaccinate every pregnant woman, record her delivery outcome, register every newborn delivery, administer birth doses and all vaccination events thereafter.

3 HC Chief Justices, 2 Senior Judges To Take Oath In Supreme Court Today.



It was spotted by the side of the road south of the town of Newman, The Guardian reported.

At least 15 people, including civilians, were killed in an Israeli rocket strike that hit a residential building in Damascus's Kafr Sousa neighbourhood early on Sunday, reported AFP quoting the Syrian Observatory for human rights. The Israeli airstrikes targeted a heavily guarded security complex close to Iranian installations, witnesses and officials told Reuters.

North Korea Confirms Testing Ballistic Missile.

North Korea tested a Hwasong-15 intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM) on Saturday in a "sudden launching drill" that confirmed its readiness for "mobile and mighty counterattack" against hostile forces, as per the state news agency KCNA. North Korea on Saturday afternoon launched a long-range ballistic missile into the sea off Japan's west coast. The launch came after North Korea warned of a strong response to South Korea and US' upcoming drills.

Biden Announces \$500 Million Aid Package And More Arms Supplies To Ukraine During Surprise Visit.

US President Joe Biden on Monday announced new military aid and a fresh round of sanctions on Russia during his surprise visit to Ukraine to meet with President Volodymyr Zelensky. This is Biden's first visit to a war zone as president. Biden announced an aid package worth \$500 million that would include artillery ammunition, more javelins and howitzers.

North Korea Fires Ballistic Missile Towards South Korea's Eastern Waters.

North Korea launched an unspecified ballistic missile on Monday, the South Korean military said. This is North Korea's second missile launch in less than 48 hours and a day after joint US-South Korean drills, as reported by the news agency AFP. "North Korea fired an unspecified ballistic missile toward the East Sea on Monday," Seoul's Joint Chief of Staff said, according to the official Yonhap news agency, referring to the body of water also known as the Sea of Japan.

Russian President Announces Suspension Of Participation In Last Remaining Nuclear Treaty With US

President Vladimir Putin said on Tuesday that Russia would withdraw from the New START (Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty) pact with the United States, which limits the two countries' strategic nuclear arsenals. The New START treaty was signed in Prague in 2010, went into effect the following year, and was renewed for five years in 2021, shortly after US President Joe Biden took office.

It restricts the amount of strategic nuclear warheads that the US and Russia can deploy, as well as the use of land-based and submarine-based missiles and bombers to deliver them.

Magnitude Earthquake Hits Tajikistan Near China Border





An earthquake of magnitude 7.2 on the Richter scale struck Tajikistan at around 8:37 a.m. (0037 GMT), at a depth of 10 km (6 miles), reported Chinese state television CCTV on Thursday. The epicentre was located about 82 kilometres from the nearest border with China and was strongly felt in Kashgar and Artux in the western part of the Xinjiang region,

The latest financing under the World Bank's Public Expenditures for Administrative Capacity Endurance in Ukraine(PEACE) project lifts the total to \$20.6 billion and will support salaries in core government functions and sectors such as healthcare and education while allowing Kyiv to pay pensions and support internally displaced people.

Pakistan receives \$700 mln funds.

Pakistan's Finance Minister Ishaq Dar said his country has received \$700 million funds from the China Development Bank. The deposit comes as Pakistan has been struggling with its external debt and has barely enough dollars to cover less than three weeks' worth of imports.

India-Germany Agreement to build 6 submarines for \$5.2 billion.

German Chancellor Olaf Scholz's visit to India on February 25–26 will focus on advancing a \$5.2 billion agreement between Germany and India to jointly construct six conventional submarines in India. The naval project is a Western military manufacturing power's most recent effort to wean New Delhi off of its reliance on Russian military hardware.

Earthquake Of 5.5 Magnitude Hits Central Turkiye, 37th Tremor In 66 Hours.

This is the 37th felt earthquake in Central Turkey in the last 66 hours, European-Mediterranean Seismological Centre said. According to news agency Reuters, the quake occurred at a depth of 10km. Saturday's quake comes just weeks after the border areas of the country were devastated by by a larger earthquake that killed more than 50,000 people and destroyed thousands of homes.





Los Angeles Sees Rare Snow Storm And Heavy Rain, Causing Large Power Outages.

Heavy snowfall was witnessed in southern California, including hills around Los Angeles which saw the first blizzard in generations while flooding threatened other places. Snow and high winds brought down power lines, resulting in power outages for more than 100,000 customers in California,

Indian Army launched a joint training exercise Cyclone-1 with Egypt

- The first-ever combined exercise between the Indian Army's special forces and the Egyptian Army, dubbed "Exercise Cyclone-I," has been underway at Jaisalmer, Rajasthan, since January 14, 2023.
- The exercise intends to strengthen bilateral defense cooperation by focusing on the exchange of professional skills and interoperability of Special Forces in a desert environment while conducting counter-terrorism, reconnaissance, raids, and other special operations.

For ISRO's Aditya L1 project, IIA handed over Visible Line Emission Coronagraph payload

- The Visible Line Emission Coronagraph (VELC) payload for the Aditya-Lı mission was handed over to ISRO by the Indian Institute of Astrophysics (IIA) on January 26, 2023.
- The event was organized at the Centre for Research and Education in Science and Technology (CREST) Campus at Hosakote, near Bengaluru.
- The VELC payload was conceived and built on the CREST site. At URSC, the payload would be integrated with the satellite.

IISc launches new research programme

The Indian Institute of Science (IISc) in collaboration with Brunel University London has launched a £100,000 (₹1,00,00,000) programme for joint research projects in areas of combustion, manufacturing, design and energy. The Brunel-IISc International Collaboration Programme was announced on 1 February during a visit by Brunel's Vice-Chancellor and President Professor Andrew Jones to IISc's campus in Bengaluru. The programme is being rolled out in support of the universities' aim to build long-term research and educational collaboration.

111 Payloads, 105 Space Debris 'Identified As Indian Objects' Orbiting Earth.

Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Science & Technology Dr Jitendra Singh said Thursday a total of 111 payloads and 105 space debris, which have been identified as Indian objects, are orbiting the Earth as on January 20, 2023, as per USSPACECOM, which tracks and catalogues such objects also, ISRO has carried out 21 collision avoidance manoeuvres of Indian Operational Space assets in 2022.

Hunting For Rare Toad, Scientists Discover A Voiceless Species Of Frog.

Researchers have discovered a previously unknown species of frog, which is unique in itself because it is voiceless. The team has described the Ukaguru spiny-throated reed frog (Hyperolius ukaguruensis) in the journal PLOS One. (Image Source: Christoph Liedtke/University of Cincinnati)

Microsoft Launches ChatGPT-Powered Bing Search, Edge Browser.

Microsoft on Tuesday launched a new version of its Bing search engine and Edge browser. Microsoft-owned professional network LinkedIn on Wednesday announced that it has crossed 100 million members in India. The country has witnessed a 56 per cent growth in its member base over the last three years and has cemented its position as the second-largest market for LinkedIn globally.

ISRO to make 2nd attempt to launch new mini-vehicle SSLV tomorrow.

Isro will make a second attempt to launch its newly-developed mini-PSLV or Small Satellite Launch Vehicle (SSLV), which can carry a maximum payload of 500kg to space, from Sriharikota on Friday morning. In its maiden flight on August 7 last year, the SSLV had failed to place the satellites in their desired.

Twitter Suffers Massive Outage, Users Get Message They Have Exceeded Daily Tweet Limit Twitter suffered a massive outage where its users were unable to tweet, send direct messages and use other features. This was the largest outage ever that Twitter has suffered. "Twitter may not be working as expected for some of you. Sorry for the trouble. We're aware and working to get this fixed," Twitter's support account tweeted.

Space Dust, Including That From Moon, Could Protect Earth From Climate Change,

Space dust, including that launched from the Moon, can protect the Earth from climate change by acting as a sunshield, a new study suggests. Greenhouse gases emitted due to various human activities form a blanket around Earth, and trap the Sun's energy. This increases Earth's temperature gradually, and is one of the reasons behind global warming. In order to avoid the trapping of heat by greenhouse gases, a fraction of the sunlight must be intercepted before it reaches Earth, according to the study.

Quad Nations begins Public Campaign To Improve Cyber Security.

The commencement of a public campaign to strengthen cyber security in these four countries has been announced by The Quad, a plurilateral structure made up of India, Australia, Japan, and the US.

ISRO launches SSLV-D2 rocket with 3 satellites lifts off from Sriharikota.

ISRO launches Small Satellite Launch Vehicle-SSLV-D2- from Satish Dhawan Space Centre at Sriharikota to put three satellites EOS-07, Janus-1 & AzaadiSAT-2 satellites into a 450 km circular orbit.

NASA to launch 'Mars mission' on Blue Origin's New Glenn.

Jeff Bezos-led Blue Origin scored a big contract from the American space agency, Nasa, to launch a mission to Mars. The private space company was given its first interplanetary NASA contract to launch the mission to study the magnetic field around the Red Planet. The expected launch date for the mission is 2024.

Saudi Arabia To Send Its First Woman Astronaut Into Space In Second Quarter Of 2023.

This is the latest attempt by the kingdom to change its ultra-conservative image. The official Saudi Press Agency announced on Sunday that Rayyana Barnawi and fellow Saudi male astronaut Ali Al-Qarni will embark on a mission to the International Space Station (ISS) "during the second quarter of 2023.

Lexi': India's first AI assistant powered by ChatGPT.

Lexi, a ChatGPT-powered AI chatbot, has arrived in India. Velocity, a financial technology firm, launched the chatbot to assist e-commerce owners by presenting them with business information in a simplified manner. Velocity insights, Velocity's proprietary analytics platform, has been linked with the chatbot.

World's First Cloud-Built Demonstration Satellite Launched JANUS-1 Successfully.

LOS ALTOS, Calif., Feb. 10, 2023 /PRNewswire/ -- Antaris, creator of the most advanced software platform for space, announced today that the world's first satellite fully conceived, designed and manufactured using the company's end-to-end cloud platform has successfully reached orbit. JANUS-1 rode on the Indian Space Research Organization's (ISRO) SSLV-D2 rocket, which was launched from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre of India under a commercial arrangement with New Space India Limited (NSIL). The satellite features five payloads from a range of global providers, which will be commissioned and begin nominal operations in the coming days.

These Silicon Nanowires Can Produce Hydrogen From Water And Sunlight.





A team of researchers has engineered silicon nanowires that can produce hydrogen from water and sunlight. Hydrogen is a greener alternative to fossil fuels. The nanowires, developed by researchers from University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, can split water into oxygen and hydrogen gas, and hence, convert sunlight into electricity.

Special 'Protein Toolbox' Developed By IIT Guwahati Can Convert Skin Cells To Heart Cells.

Researchers from the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Guwahati have developed a special 'Protein Toolbox' which can be used to convert skin cells into heart cells, and hence, fix a damaged heart. Known as a 'Recombinant Protein Toolbox', it comprises six special proteins, and can be used to regenerate damaged heart tissues.

India's lunar mission Chandrayaan-3 achieves another milestone.



India vice-captain Smriti Mandhana's half-century (52 off 41 balls) and an entertaining 34-ball 47 from Richa Ghosh went in vain as India lost their ICC Women's T20 World Cup group match to England by 11 runs on Saturday. India restricted England to 151 for seven with medium pacer Renuka Singh (5/15) registering her best bowling figures in the format after India opted to bowl. Her five-wicket haul gave India hope that they could defeat the Heather Knight-led side, but Sarah Glenn (2/27 in 4 overs) and Sophie Ecclestone's (1/11 in 3 overs) restrictive bowling didn't allow Indian batters play their strokes freely.

Saurashtra beats Bengal By Nine Wickets To Bag Second Ranji Trophy Title.

Left-arm pacer Jaydev Unadkat claimed a match haul of nine wickets, including 6/85 in the second innings, as Saurashtra thrashed Bengal by nine wickets in the Ranji Trophy final here on Sunday.

Brief Scores Bengal 174 and 241 in 70.4 overs (Manoj Tiwary 68, Anustup Majumdar 61; Jaydev Unadkat 6/85, Chetan Sakariya 3/76). Saurashtra: 404 and 14/1 in 2.4 overs. Saurashtra won by nine wickets.

India Beat Australia In 2nd Test of The Border-Gavaskar Trophy.

The Indian team outplayed the Australians by six wickets in the second Test and took a 2-o lead in the four-match series in another three-day finish on Sunday. India got the target of 115 after they restricted the Kangaroo's batters for 113 in their second innings. India completed the chase in 26.4 overs on the third day of the match.

Virat Kohli Breaks Sachin Tendulkar's All-Time Record, Becomes Quickest To Score 25,000 Runs In International Cricket.

India batter Virat Kohli scaled another historic milestone in his career, becoming the fastest batter to score 25,000 runs in international cricket. He did so on Day 3 of the second Test against Australia in New Delhi. In the process, Kohli surpassed his idol and the Master Blaster, Sachin Tendulkar, who had reached the landmark in 577 matches. Virat, on the other hand, did so in 549 matches. Following Virat and Sachin are the likes of Ricky Ponting (588), Jacques Kallis (594), Kumar Sangakkara (608) and Mahela Jayawardene (701).

Women's T20 World Cup: Hayley Matthews' All-Round Show Steers West Indies To Thrilling Win Over Pakistan.

West Indies registered a thrilling three-run win over Pakistan in their Women's T20 World Cup face-off to keep their dim hopes of a semifinal qualification alive at the Boland Park, Paarl on Sunday. Opting to bat first, the Windies had





posted 116/6 with the help of useful knocks from Rashada Williams (30 off 34) and Hayley Matthews (20 off 21) with S Campbelle (22), Chinelle Henry (11) and Shabika Gajnabi (13) also chipping in with the bat

India Beat Ireland To Reach T20 WC Semis In Rain-Affected Match.

India women's cricket team qualified for Women's T20 World Cup semi-final after winning the rain-affected match against Ireland women's cricket team at St. George Park in Gqebera on Monday, February 20. India secured a 5-run win vs Ireland on the D/L method. Smirit Mandhana, who was dropped thrice by Ireland fielders during the match, starred with the bat as she played a heroic 87-run knock off 56 balls -- her career best score, highest score by an Indian women's batter in T20Is.

Ben Stokes breaks the record for the most number of sixes ever hit in a Test match.

England Test captain Ben Stokes became the player to hit the most number of sixes in the history of Test cricket, surpassing England coach and former New Zealand cricketer Brendon McCullum in the match against New Zealand.

The England batters warmed up for the knockout stages with a thrilling display, smashing Pakistan's attack to all corners of Newlands as they reached 213/5 in their 20 overs, Pakistan ended their tournament in disappointing fashion, managing to avoid being bowled out, but finishing on 99/9.

Sania Mirza Indian star retires from tennis.

The 36-year-old Sania, who turned Pro in 2003, walks out of competitive tennis with six Grand Slam titles, including three women's doubles with Swiss legend Martina Hingis. She won two of her three mixed doubles with compatriot Mahesh Bhupathi (2009 Australian Open and 2012 French Open). She won the US Open trophy with Bruno Soares.

Indian boxing team appoints new foreign coach.

State Bank of India (SBI) gave loans worth as much as \$2.6 billion to the Adani Group of companies, reported Bloomberg citing a person familiar with the matter. According to the report, the person said that SBI's loans to companies in the Adani conglomerate are about half of what is allowed under the rules.

SBI Chairman said lending to Adani Group projects is with regard to one having tangible assets and adequate cash flows.

State Bank of India (SBI) on Friday said its overall exposure to the Adani Group is at 0.88 per cent of the book or around Rs 27,000 crore. After the country's largest lender reported a 62 per cent growth in its net profit at Rs 15,477 crore during the December 2022 quarter, SBI chairman Dinesh Khara said that the bank has not given any loans against shares to the group, reported PTI.





Pakistani Rupee Continues Speedy Crash Against USD, Suffers Another Big Fall.

According to Pakistan media Geo News, since the start of this year, the rupee has depreciated by 44.92 against the US dollar.

The Pakistani rupee (PKR) has continued a speedy crash against the US dollar with another big fall as the greenback was traded at a record high price of 276.58 PKR in the interbank market, the central bank announced.

Modi Govt Likely To Increase Dearness Allowance By 4%.

The central government is likely to increase dearness allowance (DA) for its over one crore employees and pensioners by four percentage points to 42 per cent from existing 38 per cent as per the agreed formula for the purpose.

Telangana Finance Minister Harish Rao Presents Rs 2.90 Lakh Crore Budget.

Telangana Finance Minister T Harish Rao presented the budget in the Assembly on Monday. He commented that Telangana focuses on both development and welfare in the state. The Finance Minister presented an Rs 2,90,396 crores budget with a Revenue Expenditure of Rs 2,11,685 crore while capital expenditure was Rs 37,525 crores.

RBI repo rate hike

RBI hikes repo rate: RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das released the Monetary Policy statement on Wednesday, February 8, 2023. The Monetary Policy 2023 includes an increase in the repo rate by 25 basis points. The RBI has increased the repo rate by a cumulative 250 basis points to 6.50 per cent since May this year.

New Leave Encashment Rule: Non-Govt Employees To Gain Rs 20,000 Per Year,

Revenue secretary Sanjay Malhotra said those outside the government stand to gain at least Rs 20,000 annually due to the change in tax rules for leave encashment

The Union Budget announced several measures to offer relief to salaried individuals and the common man. Finance Minister (FM) Nirmala Sitharaman proposed to raise tax exemption on leave encashment on the retirement of non-government salaried employees to Rs 25 lakh from Rs 3 lakh. "In line with the increase in government salaries, I am proposing to increase this limit to Rs 25 lakh," the FM said.

Reliance To Invest Rs 75,000 Crore In UP In 4 Years.

At UP Global Investor Summit 2023 in Lucknow, Mukesh Ambani said, "Reliance to invest Rs 75,000 crore in next four years in UP across telecom, retail and new energy business...Reliance will set up 10 GW of renewable capacity in Uttar Pradesh, start bio-energy business in state."

Adani company gives up bid to acquire DB Power.

Gautam Adani-led Adani Power said on Wednesday an agreement signed last year to acquire DB Power, which operates a thermal power plant in Chhattisgarh, for an enterprise value of Rs 7,017 crore, has expired. The date to complete the process was extended four times after the initial deal was signed in August 2022. "We wish to inform that the long stop date under the memorandum of understanding (MoU) dated August 18, 2022, has expired," Adani Power said in a stock exchange notice on Wednesday, but did not provide details as to whether the date will be extended or the agreement will be renegotiated







LEGAL CURRENT AFFAIRS

The Union government notified the formation of three Grievance Appellate Committees (GACs) that will address user complaints against social media and other internet-based platforms. These panels will also be empowered to oversee and revoke content moderation-related decisions taken by these platforms. Each of the three GACs will have a chairperson, two whole-time members from different government entities and retired senior executives from the industry for a term of three years from the date of assumption of office. The First Panel will be chaired by the chief executive officer of the Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre under the Ministry of Home Affairs. The Second Panel will be chaired by the joint secretary in charge of the Policy and Administration Division in the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting. The Third Panel will be chaired by a senior scientist at the Ministry of Electronics and IT (MeitY). GACs will deal with two categories of disputes: Violation of law and rights of users including the right to free speech and privacy. Contractual dispute between a platform's community guidelines and a user.

Armenia appealed to the International Court of Justice (ICJ) to order Azerbaijan to dissolve the road blockade isolating Nagorno-Karabakh. Armenia appealed to the courtwith a demand to apply interim measures and oblige Azerbaijan to open the Lachin corridor - now blocked for fiftyone days - ensuring the free movement of people and vehicles, and restore the electrical supply to Nagorno-Karabakh. Nagorno-Karabakh is within Azerbaijan but had been under the control of ethnic Armenian forces since 1994 when a separatist war ended. The conflict can be traced back to the pre-Soviet era when the region was at the meeting point of Ottoman, Russian and the Persian empires. The self-declaration

independence by Nagorno-Karabakh September 1991 in the backdrop of an imminent collapse of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR) resulted in a war between Azerbaijan and Nagorno-Karabakh — supported by Armenia.

The Supreme Court's 5-Judge Constitutional bench presided by Justice K M Joseph has ruled that armed forces can take action against their officers for adulterous acts, while stating the decriminalization of adultery does not apply to Armed Forces. The SC clarified that in the 2018 judgment, the SC was concerned only with the validity of Section 497 of the IPC and Section 198(2) of the CrPC dealing with adultery, and had "no occasion whatsoever to consider the effect" with respect to the Army, Navy and Air Force Acts. The Bench delivered the final Order in the case, clarifying that the Joseph Shine Judgment did not apply to members of the armed forces who are accused of 'conduct unbecoming' and dismissed the application. In September 2018 Joseph Shine Judgment, the SC struck down Section 497 of the IPC that criminalised adultery, ruling that it was unconstitutional and violated women's right to equality in treating them as inferior to their husbands.

A bench, headed by Chief Justice of India Dhananjaya Y Chandrachud, held that there is no manifest arbitrariness in the relevant provision in the Representation of People









Act (RPA) that may warrant an intervention by the court in this matter, which, it said, falls "squarely within the legislative domain" and "realm of policy". The plea had challenged the constitutionality of Section 33(7) of the Representation of Peoples Act, 1951, citing that it is unreasonable for creating extra burden on the public exchequer as by-elections will invariably follow because candidates have to give up one seat in case, they win on both the seats.

6. The recent data presented by the Ministry of Tribal Affairs (MoTA) revealed that the National Commission for Scheduled Tribes (NCST) is currently functioning with less than 50% of its sanctioned strength.

NCST: It was set up in 2004 by amending Article 338 and by inserting a new article 338A in the Constitution through the 89th Constitution Amendment Act, 2003. Hence, it is a constitutional body. By this amendment, the erstwhile National Commission for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes was replaced by two separate Commissions namely: the National Commission for Scheduled Castes (NCSC), and the NCST. Article 338A inter-alia gives powers to the NCST to oversee the implementation of various safeguards provided to Scheduled Tribes (STs) under the Constitution or under any other law for time being in force or under any other order to the Government and to evaluate the working of such safeguards.

The Supreme Court (SC) division bench headed by Justice KM Joseph observed that there is a growing consensus around hate speech and stressed there is no scope for hate crimes on the basis of religion in a secular country like India. And, it is the primary duty of the State to protect citizens from hate crimes. Hate crime is neither well defined in the Indian legal framework nor can it be easily reduced to a standard definition due to the myriad forms it can take. However, Hate speeches are dealt under IPC under Sections 153A, 153B, 295A, 298, 505(1) and 505(2) that declares that word, spoken or written, that promotes disharmony, hatred, or insults on basis of religion, ethnicity, culture, language, region, caste, community, race etc., is punishable under law.

9. MeitY recently issued orders to block 138 online betting platforms and 94 money lending apps on an "urgent" and "emergency" basis under Section 69 (A) of the IT Act, 2000. Some of the sites and apps were allegedly linked to China and contained "material prejudicial to the sovereignty and integrity of India". Over the past 3 years, there have been several complaints extortion/harassment from people who borrowed small amounts through such money-lending apps, often at exorbitantly high interest rates. Recently, the SC (Supreme Court) asked the SEBI (Securities and Exchange Board of India) and the government about the existing regulatory framework in place to protect Indian middle-class investors. Assuring the SEBI that it does not intend to go on a "witch-hunt" and is more interested in an 'open dialogue", a three-judge Bench led by Chief Justice of India D.Y. Chandrachud flagged the court's concern for Indian investors and highlighted the need to protect them from such sudden market volatility in the future. This comes after the Adani Group accused of stock manipulation and

accounting fraud by the American firm Hindenburg Research. Earlier, a number of small investors lost lakhs of crores due to rapid market volatility following a collapse in the value of the shares of the Adani Group. The stock markets sometimes experience sharp and unpredictable price movements, either down or up. These movements are often referred to as a "volatile market" and can occur over a period of days, weeks, or months.

Supreme Court sought response from Centre on a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) that contends that not electing a Deputy Speaker to the 17th (present) Lok Sabha, since 2019, is "against the letter and spirit of the Constitution". The post has also been lying vacant in the five state Assemblies including Rajasthan, Uttarakhand, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, and Jharkhand. Article 93 says that the House of the People (Lok Sabha) shall, as soon as may be, choose two members to be Speaker and Deputy Speaker so often as the offices become vacant. However, it does not provide a specific time frame. Article 178 contains the corresponding position for Speaker and Deputy Speaker of the Legislative Assembly of a state. Courts usually don't intervene in the procedural conduct of Parliament. However, Experts argue that the courts do have jurisdiction to at least inquire into why there has been no election to the post of Deputy Speaker since the Constitution does envisage an election "as soon as may be".

Parliament empowered to convert State into one or more Union Territories by enacting law: Supreme Court

The bench noted that Article 3 says that parliament may, by law, form new States and alter areas, boundaries or names of the existing States, and this power extends to UTs.

The Supreme Court on Monday held that as per the Constitution of India, the parliament is empowered to convert an existing State into one or more Union Territories (UT) by enacting a law to that effect [*Haji Abdul Gani Khan v Union of India*].



A bench of Justices **Sanjay Kishan Kaul** and **AS Oka** made the observation in its judgment which <u>dismissed the petition</u> challenging notifications for the delimitation of assembly constituencies in the Union Territory (UT) of Jammu and Kashmir (J&K).

"On a conjoint reading of Articles 3,4 and 239A, we find that:- a) Parliament by making a law can convert an existing State into one or more Union territories," said the court.

The bench noted that <u>Article 3</u> says that parliament may by law form new States and alter areas, boundaries or names of the existing States, and this power extends to UTs.

"Explanation I makes it amply clear that the power of Parliament under Clause (a) of Article 3, to make a law to form a new State or to alter a boundary of a State includes a power to make a law to form a new Union Territory," the judgment

Further, the Court highlighted <u>Article 4 (2)</u> which clarifies that no law made by Article 3 would be considered an amendment to the Constitution for the purposes of Article 368.

Thus, even if laws made by parliament, creating a body of legislature for Union territories of Puducherry and J&K has the effect of amending certain parts of the Constitution, it would not be considered an amendment to the Constitution for purposes of Article 368.

The top court also rejected the argument of the petitioners regarding violation of provisions contained in <u>Article 170</u> (3), while clarifying that it does not deal with the legislatures of UTs at all.

"Articles 239A and 239AA which are included in Part VIII of the Constitution are the Articles that deal with the creation of a body to function as legislature and Council of Ministers for certain Union Territories."





The Court went on to consider that as per Section 13 of the <u>I&K Reorganisation Act</u>, Article <u>239A</u> became applicable to the UT and as per Article 239A (2), law contemplated under the provision would not be viewed as an amendment to the Constitution for purposes of Article 368.

With this reasoning, the apex court concluded that the parliament was empowered to create a body of legislature for Union territories of Puducherry and J&K.

"Accordingly, sub-Section (2) of Section 14 of the J&K Reorganisation Act provides that there shall be a Legislative Assembly for the Union Territory of J&K."

While dismissing the petition, the Court said that it has not ruled upon the validity of the J&K Re-organisation Act, 2019 which is pending before it in a batch of petitions challenging abrogation of Article 370 of the Constitution.

The Court also said that the position of north-eastern States of Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur and Nagaland with respect to conduct of delimitation exercise cannot be compared to that of the newly-created UT of J&K.

Service of notice through email not valid: Supreme Court Registrar

As per the Surpeme Court Rules, notice must be sent by registered post to respondents.

Service of notice through e-mail is not valid service as per rules, the Supreme Court Registrar has said [Hardev Ram Dhaka v Union of India].

In proceedings being held before Registrar H **Shashidhara Shetty**, notice served respondents through e-mail was found to be an invalid service as per rules.

"As per office report, notice was served upon respondent Nos.2 and 3 through e-mail, which is not valid service, as per rules. Hence, counsel for the petitioner is granted two weeks' time to take



fresh steps and file fresh particulars in respect of respondent Nos.2 and 3. Dasti, in addition, is allowed as prayed for," the registrar said.

The top court had in 2010 decided to experiment with email notices to respondents to reduce lags resulting from the traditional method of serving notices.

<u>During the Covid-19 lockdown</u>, several courts including the Supreme Court had allowed for summons and notices to be served through email, fax and instant messaging applications like WhatsApp.

As per the Supreme Court Rules, notice must be sent by registered post to respondents.

Supreme Court hearings to be transcribed live for the first time



Live transcription has been launched on an experimental basis in the court room of Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud.

In a first, the Supreme Court of India will use Artificial Intelligence (AI) and technology driven by Natural Language Processing for live transcription of its hearings.

Live transcription has been launched on an experimental basis at 10:30 AM in the court room of Chief Justice of India (CJI) DY Chandrachud. The CJI is heading a

Constitution Bench which is hearing the case related to the power struggle in Maharashtra.

A screen displaying the live transcription of court proceedings has been placed in Court Room 1, facing the lawyers. It is also understood that the Supreme Court will make transcripts of oral arguments available on its website.

The transcription service is being done by TERES, a company which has been providing this facility to arbitration practitioners.

In her plea calling for live-streaming of important cases, Senior Advocate **Indira Jaising** had earlier suggested allowing audio transcripts of hearings for archival. In January this year, a Bench headed by CJI Chandrachud had taken these suggestions on record.

When can DNA test be ordered to ascertain paternity of child? Supreme Court lays down guidelines

The Court said that the right of children to not have their legitimacy questioned frivolously is an essential attribute of their right to privacy.



The Supreme Court on Monday held that DNA test in children to ascertain their paternity in matrimonial disputes, should be done only in exceptional cases when it becomes indispensable to resolve the controversy.

A division bench of Justices BV Nagarathna and V Ramasubramanian observed that the right of children to not have their legitimacy questioned frivolously is an essential attribute of their right to privacy.

"Children have the right not to have their legitimacy

questioned frivolously before a Court of Law. This is an essential attribute of the right to privacy. Courts are therefore







required to acknowledge that children are not to be regarded like material objects, and be subjected to forensic/DNA testing, particularly when they are not parties to the divorce proceeding. It is imperative that children do not become the focal point of the battle between spouses," the Court said.

Hence, the Court laid down the factors to be considered while deciding the question of whether a DNA Test of a minor child should be ordered at the behest of either parent.

The Court laid down the following principles of law dealing with the presumption of legitimacy of a child born during wedlock under section 112 of Evidence Act and the circumstances under which this presumption can be rebutted through evidence:

- (a) The object behind the presumption of legitimacy laid down under Section 112 qua a child born during the wedlock read with Section 4 of the Indian Evidence Act, 1872, is to prevent an unwarranted enquiry as to the paternity of the child whose parents at the relevant time had "access" to each other.
- (b) For rebutting the presumption of legitimacy under Section 112 of Indian Evidence Act, 1872, the party questioning the legitimacy of the minor child is required to prima facie show "non-access" to other party. Further, if no plea has been raised as to "non-access", the DNA Test may not be directed.
- (c) That a direction to conduct a DNA Test of a minor child should be viewed from the prism of the child, keeping in mind the best interest of the child.
- (d) Such a direction should be ordered by the Court rarely, and only in exceptional and deserving cases, where such a test becomes indispensable to resolve the controversy.
- (e) An adverse inference under <u>Section 114(h)</u> of Evidence Act cannot be drawn against the petitioner-wife who in her capacity as mother and natural guardian is refusing the DNA Test of the minor child and is protecting the interest of the child.

The petitioner-wife was represented by Senior Advocate **Huzefa Ahmadi** and advocates **Sanyat Lodha**, **Aakashi Lodha**, **Sanjana Saddy** and **Hima Bhardwaj**.

The respondent-husband was represented by Senior Advocate **Kapil Sibal**.

The Court was hearing an application filed by the wife in a divorce petition challenging orders of a family court and the Bombay High Court that had allowed DNA test on their minor child at the behest of the husband.

The question was whether the High Court and the family court had made an error in ordering the DNA test of the minor child in response to the application filed by the husband in the divorce proceedings.

He sought DNA test to ascertain paternity of the second child in order to prove his claim of adultery on the part of the wife.

"The short question in the present appeal is as to how a Court can prevent the law's tidy assumptions linking paternity with matrimony, from collapsing, particularly when parties are routinely attempting to dislodge such presumptions by employing modern genetic profiling techniques," the Court noted.

The counsel representing the petitioner-wife pointed out that the courts below routinely directed DNA tests without considering the presumption of legitimacy under Section 112 of the Indian Evidence Act, the legal principles established in the case of *Goutam Kundu v. State of West Bengal & Anr*, and the fundamental rights of the child, including their best interests, right to privacy, identity and autonomy.

On the other hand, counsel for the respondent-husband contended that the orders under challenge were based on an unimpeachable appreciation of the facts of the case and did not warrant any interference. He further contended that the appeal was filed by the petitioner to mask her adulterous conduct.





Furthermore, he contended that in the present case, the most material piece of evidence to establish the allegations of adultery was the DNA test, and that the same cannot be shut out on the ground of sensitivity or privacy.

The Court began its judgment by saying,

"Under the Indian legal spectrum, a husband is strongly presumed to be the father of a child born to his wife. Thus, there is a strong presumption regarding the paternity of a child. This presumption can be overcome only by evidence precluding any procreative role of the husband, such as by showing that the husband and wife had no access to each other at the relevant time of possible conception. In the absence of proof of non-access, the law considers the husband's paternity to be conclusively established if they cohabited when the child was likely to have been conceived."

It ruled that the dispute was between the parties to the marriage and that the rights and best interests of the child could not be sacrificed to enable one of the parties to have the benefit of a fair trial.

"The lis in these cases is between the parties to a marriage. The lis is not between one of the parties to the marriage and the child whose paternity is questioned. To enable one of the parties to the marriage to have the benefit of fair trial, the Court cannot sacrifice the rights and best interests of a third party to the lis, namely, the child," the Court said.

Specifically with regard to the case, the Court noted that the husband himself had categorically claimed that he was in possession of call recordings/transcripts and the daily diary of the appellant-wife, which may be summoned in accordance with law to prove the infidelity of the appellant.

"Therefore, it seems to us that the respondent is in a position to attempt to make out a case based on such evidence, as to adultery/infidelity on the part of the appellant," the Court said.

Hence, it ruled that a DNA test would not be the only way in which the truth of the matter can be established.

The Court, therefore, allowed the appeal by the wife and set aside the order of the family court and Bombay High Court which had allowed DNA test.

"However, this shall not preclude the respondent-husband from leading any other evidence to establish the allegations made by him against the appellant in the petition for divorce," the Court said.

The Court also clarified that Section 112 does not provide protection for the alleged adulterous behavior of the wife.

"We are not suggesting for a moment that Section 112 acts as a shield even for the alleged adulterous conduct on the part of the wife. All that we say is that anything that would destroy the legal effect of Section 112 cannot be used by the respondent, on the ground that the same is being done to achieve another result," it said.







Supreme Court issues fresh directions for implementing law prohibiting Manual Scavenging

The Union Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment was asked to place on record an affidavit containing information on questions raised by the Court.

The Supreme Court on Wednesday issued directions towards implementation of the Prohibition of Employment as Manual Scavengers and their Rehabilitation Act, 2013 and the Employment of Manual Scavengers and Construction of Dry Latrines (Prohibition) Act, 1993. (Dr Balram Singh v. Union of India and ors)

A Bench of Justices S Ravindra Bhat and Dipankar **Datta** appointed Advocate K Parameshwar Amicus Curiae in the matter.





- (I) the respondent Union shall place on record the steps taken pursuant to the judgment of this Court, viz.-a-viz. The Status of implementation of the 2013 Act i.e. Prohibition of Employment as Manual Scavengers and Their Rehabilitation Act, including the steps towards rehabilitation of such persons falling within the definition of 'Manual Scavengers'.
- (II) Steps taken towards abolition/demolition of Dry Latrines, statewise.
- (III) Status of Dry Latrines and Safai Karamcharies in Cantonment Boards and Railways.
- (IV) Employment of Safai Karamcharies in Railways and Cantonments Boards whether directly or indirectly i.e. through Contractors or otherwise.
- (V) Statewise set up of Municipal Corporation and the nature of equipment (as well as the description of technical equipment), deployed by such bodies to mechanize sewage cleaning.
- (VI) The feasibility of developing internet based solutions for real time tracking of sewage deaths and action taken by their concerned authorities including the appropriate Government towards payment of compensation and rehabilitation of families.

The Union Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment was asked to place on record an affidavit containing information on these issues within six weeks. The matter will be taken up next on April 12, 2023.

The National Commission for Safai Karamcharis, the National Commission for Scheduled Castes, and the National Commission for Scheduled Tribes were added as respondents.

The petitioner-in-person in the matter, Dr Balram Singh, had sought directions for implementation of the two Acts.

The Supreme Court at the outset referred to its decision in <u>Safai Karamchari Andolan And Others v. Union of India And</u> Others, where guidelines for compliance with the 2013 Act were issued.





In that order, among other things, the Court had sought rehabilitation, cash assistance, and residential plots for existing manual scavengers. Stipends were also to be provided to their families so they could be trained in alternative professions, and the government was asked to identify and phase out the practice from railway tracks.

Further, the government was directed to clamp down on sewer deaths, issue ₹10 lakh compensation to the next of kin in such cases, and make it illegal to enter sewers without safety equipment.

With respect to the claims in the present plea, and since the directions sought were in public interest, the Court has proceeded to be apprised of the steps taken for enforcement of provisions of the two Acts.

Replying to a question in the Rajya Sabha, the Union Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment had in July 2021 stated that <u>no deaths have been reported due to manual scavenging</u> in the last five years.

Interestingly, at the time, at least three High Courts in the country - those of Karnataka, Orissa and Madras - were hearing cases related to manual scavenging, and deaths of people who entered manholes to clean them.

Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati, with Advocates Gurmeet Singh Makker, Ruchi Kohli, Shradha Deshmukh, and Swarupama Chaturvedi appeared for the respondents.






