Attaining international recognition, the Ayodhya Airport undergoes a name change to 'Maharishi Valmiki International Airport.'

- The Union Cabinet has greenlit the declaration of Ayodhya Airport as an international airport, with the proposed name "Maharishi Valmiki International Airport, Ayodhyadham." This decision, emphasizing the historical and cultural significance of the region, signifies a notable step forward in the airport's recognition and status.
- According to the government's press release, elevating Ayodhya Airport to international status is crucial for realizing the city's economic potential. Furthermore, it acknowledges Ayodhya's significance as a global pilgrimage site, with the international status expected to attract foreign pilgrims and tourists.
- The airport's development will occur in phases. In its initial phase, the airport will have the capacity to handle 10 lakh (1 million) passengers annually. After the second phase of development, Maharishi Valmiki International Airport is expected to cater to a staggering 60 lakh (6 million) commuters annually.

Yuki Bhambri and Robin Haase face defeat in the semifinals of the Brisbane International, signaling an end to their campaign in the tournament.

- Yuki Bhambri-Robin Haase lost in their semi-final match, at the Brisbane International.
- Yuki Bhambri and his partner Robin Haase faced a setback in the Brisbane International ATP Tour
 tournament semifinals on Saturday. The Indo-Dutch pair, seeded eighth, experienced a close
 match against the second-seeded duo of Lloyd Glasspool (England) and Jean-Julien Rojer
 (Netherlands), ultimately losing 3-6, 7-6, 9-11. The fiercely contested match lasted for one hour
 and 40 minutes.
- The Bhambri-Haase duo had beaten the American pair of Nathaniel Lammons and Jackson Withrow in straight sets -- 7-6 (5), 7-6 (6) -- in the quarterfinals.
- Last year, the 31-year-old Bhambri from New Delhi won his maiden ATP title at the Mallorca Championships doubles competition, partnering with South African Lloyd Harris.

- Addressing the future of the textile industry, Goyal underscores the prominence of Man Made Fibre Textiles due to challenges in meeting the increasing demand for cotton.
- He encourages industry players to leverage free trade agreements with Japan, Australia, UAE, and South Korea, expressing concern over underutilization.

8 former Indian Navy personnel in Qatar given 60 days to appeal against prison terms

- The Ministry of External Affairs has disclosed that the eight incarcerated former Indian Navy personnel in Qatar have been granted a 60-day window to file appeals against the diverse prison terms imposed by a Qatari court last week. This decision follows the commutation of their earlier death sentences.
- The Court of Appeal in Qatar on December 28 commuted the death sentence handed down to the Indians in October and sentenced them to prison for varying durations, weeks after their family members filed an appeal against the earlier order by another court.
- External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said the legal team of the Indian nationals received a copy of the court order that he described as a "confidential document".
- "On December 28, the Court of Appeal had given a judgement. Thereafter, we issued a press release giving details (and) telling that the death penalty has been reduced. Now, we have the judgement order, which is a confidential document," he said.

2024 will witness the retirement of 68 Rajya Sabha members, a list that includes prominent figures such as Manmohan Singh and Jaya Bachchan.

- Anticipating a transformative year ahead, the political scenario in India is set for a notable transformation with the retirement of 68 Rajya Sabha members, including nine Union ministers.
 This development adds fervor to the competition for sought-after six-year terms in the Upper House of Parliament.
- In April, a total of 57 leaders, a prominent among them being former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh and several incumbent ministers, will complete their tenures.
- Uttar Pradesh will witness the highest number of vacancies, with 10 seats up for grabs, followed by Maharashtra and Bihar with six each.
- Other states in the fray include Madhya Pradesh, West Bengal, Karnataka, Gujarat, Odisha, Telangana, Kerala, Andhra Pradesh, Jharkhand, Rajasthan, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, and Chhattisgarh.

Rohit Sharma rates Cape Town win as 'one of India's best Test match victories'

- Bestowing high praise, India's captain Rohit Sharma has acclaimed the nation's historic Test triumph at Newlands in Cape Town, labeling it as "one of the most exceptional victories" in the annals of India's cricketing history.
- With their backs against the wall after experiencing a crushing defeat in the opening Test of the series at the SuperSport Park in Centurion, Rohit and his men scripted a praiseworthy comeback and turned the tables to defeat South Africa by seven wickets on a pacer-friendly surface in the New Year's Test at the Newlands.
- "It'll be one of our best Test match victories," Rohit told the reporters after India's triumph in the shortest Test ever played (in terms of balls bowled).
- "Having not won here in Cape Town [before], obviously this puts it right up there with all the
 victories that we've had. It's very hard to compare the Test matches that you play because every
 Test match has its own importance and own relevance. The Test match that we won at The
 Gabba as well. The last test match that was lost by Australia in Brisbane was in 1988, I think.



- Nearly after 23, 24 years (32 years), we won the Test match there. It kind of became like their fortress. They never lose a test match there," Rohit said.
- "And the way we won that Test match as well was quite important. From where we came, we were 1-nil down, we won in Melbourne and then we drew the Test match in Sydney and then won in Brisbane. So you can't really rank the Test matches, but this has to be right up there because we had not won here. That shows how important a venue this is for us to come here and perform. I give a lot of credit to our team to put up a performance like that and win the game," the India captain said.

December Witnesses Festival Demand Slowdown as PMI Manufacturing Records an 18-Month Low at 54.9

- The HSBC India Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) for manufacturing dropped to an 18-month low of 54.9 in December, down from 56 in November, signaling a slowdown.
- Despite this, the sector remains in expansion mode, marking 30 consecutive months with the index above 50, indicative of growth. The decline was attributed to a weaker rise in new orders and output.
- The manufacturing sector continued to expand in December, albeit at a softer pace, maintaining
 growth momentum despite a decline. New business gains, favorable market conditions, fairs,
 and expositions contributed to a sharp increase in manufacturing during December.

In January, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) is set to disburse a \$700 million bailout installment to Pakistan.

• Cash-strapped Pakistan is poised to receive a crucial \$700 million bailout tranche from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) during the Executive Board meeting on January 11.



- The disbursement, under the existing \$3 billion Stand-By Arrangement (SBA), is expected to provide much-needed financial support to Pakistan's struggling economy.
- The IMF Executive Board is scheduled to discuss Pakistan's case on January 11, potentially granting final approval for the release of the \$700 million tranche. The current SBA, initiated in 2019, is set to conclude in April 2024, with approximately \$1.8 billion remaining undisbursed.
- Despite earlier expectations for the Executive Board's approval in December, the decision has been deferred to January 11, as a Staff-Level Agreement between the IMF staff and Pakistani authorities awaits the Board's approval. The potential approval holds significance for Pakistan's economy, providing crucial financial support.
- Discussions between the IMF staff and Pakistani authorities continue regarding policies aimed at
 bolstering macroeconomic stability in the upcoming year. The IMF noted progress over the FY23
 budget, but the latest economic projections for Pakistan reveal a challenging outlook for 2024.
 The report added that the IMF predicts a contraction of 0.5% in the real GDP for the year and a
 significant increase in the Consumer Price Index, suggesting heightened inflationary pressures.

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) released its latest Financial Stability Report (FSR), revealing insights into the state of household financial savings and liabilities in the fiscal year 2022-23 (FY23).
- Despite a decline in gross household financial savings to 10.9% of GDP, the report emphasizes a limited risk of defaults by households, attributing it to the manageable exposure to higher mortgage payments and floating interest rates.
- The FSR notes a significant increase in household financial liabilities, rising from 3.8% of GDP in FY22 to 5.8% in FY23.
- This surge, driven by increased borrowings for physical asset creation, primarily in mortgages and vehicles, contrasts with a marginal moderation in financial assets to 10.9% in FY23 from 11.1% in FY22.



Rajasthan Seeks Integration Of Chiranjeevi Scheme With Ayushman Bharat.

- The newly elected BJP government in Rajasthan is making strides to merge its state health insurance scheme, Chiranjeevi, with the central Ayushman Bharat programme.
- This move, pending approval from the union health ministry, aims to create a unified initiative called the Ayushman Bharat Mukhyamantri Chiranjeevi Health Insurance Scheme.
- Officials reveal that the integrated scheme will maintain Chiranjeevi's existing benefits, providing a substantial ₹25 lakh insurance cover applicable to both private and government hospitals.
- The Chiranjeevi scheme, initially introduced by former Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot of the Congress party, currently offers significantly higher coverage compared to Ayushman Bharat's ₹5 lakh.

Hyderabad and Bengaluru airports achieve commendable positions in the global on-time performance rankings.

- In a recent on-time performance review conducted by aviation analytics firm Cirium, Hyderabad and Bengaluru airports have emerged as global leaders in punctuality, securing the second and third ranks, respectively.
- With over 84 per cent on-time departures, these airports have showcased their commitment to efficiency and reliability in air travel.
- IndiGo, which stood fourth among Asia Pacific airlines with over 82 per cent on-time arrivals, plays a crucial role in contributing to the punctuality at these airports. Approximately half of all flights at Bengaluru and 65 per cent in Hyderabad are operated by IndiGo.
- The Circum report stated that a flight is considered punctual if it departs or arrives with a difference of 15 minutes from the scheduled time. The Kempegowda International Airport has achieved 84.08 % punctuality rate in the year 2023, making it one of the most punctual airports in the world.
- Meanwhile, America's Minneapolis' St Paul International Airport topped the list of most airports across the globe with a punctuality rate of 84.44%

Despite a year-on-year increase, India's gross GST revenue experiences a three-month low in December.

- India GST revenue: India's Goods and Services tax revenue continued to rise on an annual basis, but it dropped to a three month low in December.
- India's GST collections rose 10.28 percent to reach Rs 1.65 lakh crore in December, the Finance Ministry announced today. The Goods and Services Tax (GST) mop-up was nearly Rs 1.50 lakh crore in December 2022. The December 2023 collections are, however, lower than Rs1.68 lakh crore collected in November and even down from Rs 1.72 lakh crore mopped up in October, which was the second-highest collection ever since the GST rollout.
- "During the month, the revenues from domestic transactions (including import of services) are 13% higher than the revenues from these sources during the same month last year," the finance ministry said in a statement.
- The average gross monthly GST collection in the FY 2023-24 now stands at Rs. 1.66 lakh crore and is 11% per cent more than that in the same period in the previous financial year," the finance ministry said in a statement.
- "The growing emphasis on audits led by specific information available on various databases, not only on the GST portal, has led to a significant increase in compliance across sectors and states," Mani added.
