India to home South Asia's first-ever Center for Species Survival

- With a vision to create a just world that values and conserves nature, IUCN Species Survival Commission has partnered with Wildlife Trust of India (WTI) to set up the first-ever Center for Species Survival in South Asia.
- In this regard, an MoU has been signed between Prof. Jon Paul Rodríguez, Chair—IUCN SSC and Vivek Menon, Executive Director, Wildlife Trust of India to set up the first-ever regional Center for Species Survival (CSS) in India. This will be the 10th Centre for Species Survival in the world and the first of its kind in South Asia.
- The Center hopes to provide a platform for conservation practitioners to network and share best practices. It will also contribute to species status assessments using the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species and amplify the impact of species recovery efforts across the country. The Centre will further act as a bridge between the national and international efforts to save species.

India's first online gaming academy set up in MP

- Madhya Pradesh is set to launch its first online gaming industry named "MP State
 Esports Academy" to provide the young esports player an opportunity and platform
 to advance to a professional level.
- The academy focuses on training aspiring gaming and esports professionals. An esports tournament will be held, selecting the top players for admission. 80% of the seats are reserved for gamers from Madhya Pradesh, while the remaining seats are open to gamers from all over the country. Anyone can participate in the tournament to compete for a spot at the academy.
- The state-wide MP Junior Esports Championship is scheduled to take place between July 27 and August 7, specifically focusing on esports enthusiasts aged between 12 and 17 years. The sports department will be responsible for organizing the 10-day tournament, providing a platform for young participants to engage and showcase their skills in the games.

World's largest private communications satellite 'Jupiter 3' launched

- SpaceX, Elon Musk's space exploration company, launched the world's largest commercial communications satellite from LC-39A, Kennedy Space Center, Florida, USA. The Falcon Heavy rocket was used for the launch, carrying Maxar Technologies' biggest satellite to date, named Jupiter 3.
- About: JUPITER 3 Also referred to as 'EcoStar XXIV', is a satellite of Hughes, an EchoStar company. As the next-generation Ultra High Density Satellite (UHDS), it is



designed to provide gigabytes of connectivity to customers across North and South America.

 EchoStar Corporation, an American company, serves as a global provider of satellite communication and Internet services through its business segments, namely Hughes Network Systems and EchoStar Satellite Services.

Cambodian PM Hun Sen to step down after four decades; hands over power to son

- Hun Sen has run kingdom since 1985, eliminating all opposition to his power, with parties banned, challengers forced to flee and freedom of expression stifled.
- Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Sen, one of the world's longest-serving leaders, said on July 26, 2023 he will resign and hand power to his son, after almost four decades of hardline rule.
- The former Khmer Rouge cadre has run the kingdom since 1985, eliminating all opposition to his power, with opposition parties banned, challengers forced to flee and freedom of expression stifled.
- His Cambodian People's Party (CPP) won a landslide victory in an election on Sunday
 with no meaningful opposition, taking 82 percent of the vote, paving the way for a
 dynastic succession to his eldest son that some critics have compared to North
 Korea.

IPORTANT DAYS

International Tiger Day

- International Tiger Day is observed globally on July 29 every year, International Tiger
 Day is celebrated to raise awareness about one of the most majestic and endangered
 creatures on our planet: the tiger. This day provides a platform for people all around
 the world to emphasise the value of tiger conservation and the immediate need to
 save these majestic big cats from extinction.
- Since they represent strength, elegance, and beauty, tigers have attracted the attention of people for millennia. They have a particular place in our hearts and ecosystems and are revered in many cultures and mythology. However, a number of reasons seriously jeopardise their continued survival. The occasion of International Tiger Day offers us a chance to unite as a global society and consider the importance of protecting these iconic animals and their natural habitats.
- History Global Tiger Day, commonly referred to as International Tiger Day, was first established in 2010 during the Saint Petersburg Tiger Summit by nations that are home to tigers. The Global Tiger Initiative (GTI), a grouping of nations, international organisations, and conservation organisations committed to tiger conservation, organised the summit, which took place in St. Petersburg, Russia. The Tiger Range Countries (TRCs), or nations with wild tiger populations, gathered during this summit to discuss the worrying global drop in tiger numbers. The 29th of July was chosen as International Tiger Day because it represents the halfway point between the first and last days of the Saint Petersburg Tiger Summit and the ongoing international campaign to rescue tigers.

TMS the Germany-based leading naval company has signed a MoU with Indian defence PSU MDL to modernize INS Shankush

- Thyssenkrupp Marine Systems (TMS), the Germany-based leading naval company, has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Indian defence PSU Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Limited (MDL) for the overhaul and modernisation of submarine INS Shankush to extend its operational capability.
- The Indian Navy is seeking extension of its seven submarines to fill the void in its required strength which once was close to 22. The Ministry of Defence had signed a ₹2,725-crore contract with Mumbai-based MDL for the Medium Refit with Life Certification (MRLC) of INS Shankush, a HDW-class submarine, to extend its life. The first submarine in this class is undergoing MRLC and is likely to be back on sail by August.
- Over the next three years, INS Shankush will be modernised in close partnership with the state-owned shipyard MDL, Thyssenkrupp Marine Systems said in a statement on Thursday. While Thyssenkrupp will be responsible for supplying material packages of selected systems, equipment and components as well as for on-site technical support and pressure hull inspection, MDL will act as general contractor up till ontime delivery of the submarine, the German naval company stated.

Tata Technologies signs MoA with Chhattisgarh worth Rs 1,188 crore

- The Chhattisgarh government has signed an agreement worth Rs 1,188.36 crore with Tata Technologies for transforming 36 government Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) into an Industry 4.0 Technology Hub.
- Under the agreement, Tata Technologies will offer six new trades and 23 new shortterm courses in the 36 ITIs, with state-of-the-art technical workshops and trainer arrangements, a state government spokesperson said. The company will also provide two trainers.
- The project aims to train over 10,000 youth annually in advanced skills, fostering better employment opportunities and will also provide employment opportunities to the skilled youth.
- The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed by Awanish Sharan, the director of skill development, technical education and employment department, and Pawan Bhageria, president of Tata Technologies Limited, in the presence of Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel.

PM inaugurates Akhil Bhartiya Shiksha Samagam

• The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated Akhil Bhartiya Shiksha Samagam at Bharat Mandapam in Delhi today 29 Juy. It coincides with the 3rd anniversary of National Education Policy 2020. He also released the first installment of funds under the PM SHRI Scheme. 6207 schools received the first installment with a total amounting to 630 crore Rupees. He also released education and skill curriculum books translated into 12 Indian languages. The Prime Minister also took a walkthrough of the exhibition showcased on the occasion.



• Addressing the gathering, the Prime Minister underlined the primacy of education among the factors that can change the destiny of the nation. "Our education system has a huge role in achieving the goals with which 21st century India is moving", he said. Emphasizing the importance of the Akhil Bhartiya Shiksha Samagam, the Prime Minister said that discussion and dialogue are important for education. The Prime Minister mentioned the coincidence of the last Akhil Bhartiya Shiksha Samagam taking place in the newly constructed Rudraksha convention center of Varanasi and this year's Akhil Bhartiya Shiksha Samagam taking place in the brand new Bharat Mandapam. This is the first event at the Mandapam after its formal inauguration.

Tech capital Bengaluru becomes 1st Indian city to join World Cities Culture Forum

- Bengaluru has joined the World Cities Culture Forum (WCCF), on Thursday, July 27, and becomes the first Indian city to achieve the feat. Founded by the office of the Mayor of London in 2021, WCCF is a global network of nearly 40 cities, which provides a way for policy makers in these cities to share research and intelligence, and explore the vital role of culture for their future prosperity.
- CCF has said that the Bengaluru city leaders will work alongside counterparts from other places, including Buenos Aires, London, New York and Tokyo for the city's growth and investment. WCCF will also work closely with Unboxing BLR Foundation, a not-for-profit initiative which aspires to make Bengaluru a vibrant, inclusive and global city. According to its website, Unboxing BLR is an initiative "to curate, facilitate and catalyze activities that will enable the citizens and communities of Bangalore to engage better with their city," and was founded in April 2022.

- Samant had drawn his eighth round game against Bu Xiangzhi. He only had to play the ninth round, no matter the result, to get the GM nor
- To become a GM, a player has to get three GM norms and cross the live rating of 2,500 Elo points. The Maharashtra youngster had already crossed the 2500 Elo mark in the live ratings and had secured two GM norms.

Renowned Marathi Writer Shirish Kanekar Passes Away

Shirish Kanekar, Veteran Marathi writer and columnist passed away in Mumbai,
 Maharashtra at the age of 80. He was born on June 6, 1943 in Pune, Maharashtra. He



worked at Marathi and English language publications like Loksatta, Indian Express, Samana, and Free Press Journal. He was popular for his newspaper columns on Cinema, Cricket and Politics.Pune, Maharashtra.

- His notable works include: Humorous articles like 'Kanekari', Fillambaji', and
 'Shirishasan'; Bollywood movies such as "Nut Bolt Bolpat," "Kanekari," and "Cricket
 Vedh"; Books such as Irsalaki; Surparambya. His collection of stories titled 'Lagaon
 Batti,' was recognised and honoured with the Maharashtra Literary Parishad Award
 for Best Comedy- Joshi Award.
- Shirish completed LLB from Mumbai University. After that, he worked as a journalist with English news publications like Indian Express, Daily, Free Press Journal, and Syndicated Press News Agency. He has written columns for newspapers like Loksatta, Maharashtra Times, Lokmat, Saamna, Pudaari, Weekly Manohar, and Weekly Lokprabha. His collection of stories, Lagav Batti was awarded the Maharashtra Sahitya Parishad. He also received the Joshi Award.

- The IUCN Red List for Threatened Species was created to assess the conservation status of various species, indicating their vulnerability to extinction.
- In 2000, the IUCN introduced nature-based solutions, which use ecosystems and biodiversity to address climate change, food security and poverty alleviation.
- World Nature Conservation Day is observed annually on 28 July to raise awareness about the importance of nature conservation and sustainable practices.

India AI And Meta Sign MoU To Collaborate On AI Technologies,

- 'India AI' and Meta entered into a collaboration aimed at advancing research and development in AI & Emerging Technologies, as per a press release from the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) on July 26, 2023. - The Aayog in a statement highlighted that the first day of the workshop will focus on themes related to energy, climate, technology, policy, and reshaping global finance for sustainable growth. The second day will discuss several themes related to multilateralism as well as adjustment, resilience, and inclusion in an uncertain world. The Aayog further said that around 40 leading thinkers will attend this conference.

India, Lao People's Democratic Republic signs MoUs for implementation of five Quick Impact Projects in different fields

- India and Lao People's Democratic Republic signed five Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) for the implementation of five Quick Impact Projects in the fields of education, health, water facility and IT were also signed. The MoUs were signed during the 3rd round of Foreign Office Consultations (FOC) between the two countries today in Vientiane, Lao PDR. The Indian side was led by Secretary (East) in the Ministry of External Affairs Saurabh Kumar and Deputy Foreign Minister of Lao PDR Phoxay Khaykhamphithoune led his side.
- According to the Ministry of External Affairs, relations between the two countries
 are historical and cordial. During the consultation, both sides comprehensively
 reviewed the spectrum of bilateral relations and discussed ways to enhance
 cooperation in development partnership, economic and trade ties, agriculture,
 health, education, defence, and heritage conservation. The two sides also exchanged
 views on regional and global issues of mutual interest, as well as cooperation in
 multilateral fora such as the United Nations, ASEAN, and Mekong Ganga
 Cooperation.

India and ADB sign \$295 million loan to upgrade state highways in Bihar

- As part of the 'Brand Bengaluru' initiative, spearheaded by Deputy Chief Minister

 signed an agreement with Canada-based World Design Organization (WDO) for
 suggestions for the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) to build the city.
- Shivakumar said that 200 engineers from the WDO will be in the city to study and give suggestions on the city infrastructure including roads, flyovers, footpaths, junctions, and other infrastructure.
- Earlier, Mr. Shivakumar had launched a 'Brand Bengaluru' campaign and also an online portal to invite suggestions on the city's development by the public.

PM Modi to inaugurate Gujarat's first Greenfield International Airport

- Prime minister Narendra Modi will dedicate the Hirasar Greenfield International Airport, Gujarat's first Greenfield Airport to the nation on Thursday during his twoday visit to Rajasthan and Gujarat from July 27-28
- Along with the airport, PM Modi will dedicate a number of key projects worth over ₹860 crore including packages 8 and 9 of the Saurashtra Narmada Avtaran Irrigation (SAUNI) Yojana.
- According to the press statement by the prime minister's office (PMO), the new airport, spanning across 2,500 acres, is envisioned to be a transportation hub for people traveling abroad from the state.
- Salient features of the Rajkot International Airport:
- The Hirasar Greenfield Airport, located at around 30 km from Rajkot, spans over 2500 acres and has been developed at a cost of ₹1,405 crore.
- The airport boasts a well-designed 3040 m (3.04 km) long and 45-meter-wide runway, capable of accommodating 14 planes simultaneously.

Amit Shah to launch cultural initiative 'Mera Gaon Meri Dharohar in New Delhi

- Union home minister and minister of cooperation Amit Shah will launch 'Mera Gaon Meri Dharohar' as part of Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav on 27 July,
- It is a pan-India initiative of the Ministry of Culture under National Mission on Cultural Mapping. Shah will officially launch the virtual platform during a grand projection mapping show at the Qutub Minar. The virtual platform https://mgmd.gov.in will connect people with villages of India.

Ladakh's Kargil gets first women police station

- The first-ever women police station has started functioning here in the Union Territory of Ladakh, it a significant step towards empowering women and ensuring their safety.
- Additional Director General of Police, Ladakh, S D Singh Jamwal inaugurated the police station, which will specifically deal with crimes against women,
- The station will operate round the clock to ensure immediate assistance and support for women in need. Additionally, it will act as a resource centre, providing guidance and counselling services for women facing challenging situations,
- After inaugurating the police station, Jamwal emphasised the importance of women's empowerment and their active participation in the law enforcement.

World's largest private satellite Jupiter-3 set to launch

- Elon Musk-led SpaceX will launch the world's largest private satellite to space on Thursday. The satellite will lift-off aboard the company's Falcon Heavy rocket from Launch Complex 39A in Florida.
- This marks the seventh launch for SpaceX's triple-booster rocket, Falcon Heavy, which first made headlines with its debut in 2018.
- The launch is scheduled for 8:34â€ïam IST on July 27. In a departure from usual practice, SpaceX will expend its core booster in the Atlantic Ocean following the first-stage separation, rather than attempting a drone-ship landing at sea.

India finish 2nd on medals tally at ISSF World Junior Championship in South Korea

- India finished 2nd on the medals tally at the recently concluded ISSF Junior Shooting World Championships 2023 in Changwon, South Korea. Indian shooters bagged 17 medals, which include 6 Gold, 6 Silver, and 5 Bronze.
- The championships saw 90 Indian shooters vie for medals in pistol, rifle, and shotgun competitions in the under-21 age category. The majority of the medalists were Khelo India athletes. Seven Indians managed to bag more than one medal. Abhinav Shaw and Kamaljeet won two golds each. Sainyam won three medals gold in the 10m air pistol women, and a bronze each in the 10m air pistol mixed team and women's team events.

China appoints Pan Gongsheng to lead central bank, succeeding Yi Gang

- Pan Gongsheng was named China's central bank governor in the widely anticipated final major appointment of the ruling Communist Party's once-a-decade change of power.
- Pan, a deputy central bank governor and veteran of China's state-owned banking industry, succeeds Yi Gang, an American-trained economist who held the post for five years. The endorsement of Pan's promotion by the ceremonial legislature, the National People's Congress, follows other Cabinet-level appointments announced in March.
- The governor of the People's Bank of China is the most prominent Chinese figure in finance circles but the post's powers are limited. The bank is controlled by the ruling Communist Party.

Wang Yi has been appointed as Foreign Minister of china

• China's foreign minister Qin Gang has been removed from his post and replaced by his predecessor Wang Yi, the country's legislature said on , In a sudden move that's



- likely to bring the focus back on the ruling Communist Party of China's (CPC) opaque politics.
- Qin, 57, has been replaced by Wang, who was China's foreign minister for a decade until December, 2022. Wang was promoted to the CPC's elite politburo last October when President XI Jinping retained the general secretary's post for a norm-breaking third time. Wang was also appointed director of the CPC's foreign affairs commission.

UAE Minister for Foreign Trade Dr Thani Al Zeyoudi elected as chair of WTO's 13th Ministerial Conference

- UAE Minister for Foreign Trade Dr Thani Al Zeyoudi has been elected as the chair of the World Trade Organisation's 13th Ministerial Conference that will be held in Abu Dhabi in February 2024. The announcement was made during the WTO General Council in Geneva, where Dr Al Zeyoudi met with the WTO director general Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala.
- The conference will be attended by representatives from the 164 countries and customs blocs that make up the WTO. It will review the performance of the trading system, make decisions on future work and set up the road map for the next conference, an official statement said on 24th July 2023.

Kargil Vijay Diwas

- Kargil Vijay Divas or Kargil Diwas is observed every year on 26 July to honour India's victory over Pakistan in the Kargil War in 1999. As part of "Operation Vijay," the Indian Army drove out intruders from Pakistan during this conflict and reclaimed Tiger Hill and other outposts. At Kargil in Ladakh, the conflict lasted for more than 60 days.
- Kargil Vijay Divas is commemorated annually in honour of the many Indian troops who lost their lives in battle. Every year, on the occasion of Kargil Vijay Divas, the Prime Minister of India pays tribute to the brave soldiers who lost their precious lives in the Kargil war, at Amar Jawan located near the India Gate, New Delhi.

International Day for the Conservation of the Mangrove Ecosystem

- The International Day for the Conservation of the Mangrove Ecosystem is observed annually on July 26th. Its purpose is to increase global understanding of the significance of mangrove ecosystems as distinct, precious, and delicate environments. The day also seeks to advocate for sustainable practices in managing, safeguarding, and utilizing these ecosystems. The General Conference of UNESCO officially adopted this International Day in 2015.
- The International Day for the Conservation of the Mangrove Ecosystem, observed on July 26th, was established by UNESCO during their General Conference in 2015 to create awareness about the critical value of mangrove ecosystems. The main objective of this day is to promote the preservation and sustainable development of mangrove forests.



 Mangrove forests hold significant ecological importance as their intricate root systems serve as protective nurseries for various organisms, shielding them from predators, extreme heat, and powerful tides. Additionally, these coastal forests are highly effective in removing five times more carbon dioxide from the atmosphere compared to terrestrial forests.

Dr. Bharati Pravin Pawar inaugurates National Conference on Moving Mental Health Beyond Institutions

- Union Minister of State for Health and Family Welfare, Dr. Bharati Pravin Pawar inaugurated a national conference on "Moving Mental Health Beyond Institutions, here today. Justice Arun Mishra, Hon'ble Chairperson, NHRC was also present on the occasion. The objective of the conference is to discuss the challenges in the implementation of the Mental Healthcare Act, 2017 and deliberate on the way forward on resolution of mental health issues.
- Highlighting the importance of addressing the challenges of mental health and the Mental Healthcare Act 2017, Dr Pawar stated that "the Union govt is promoting the availability of and access to cost-effective treatment of common mental disorders". She informed that mental health has been included in the flagship Ayushman Bharat scheme of the Union Govt. She also stated that "since the launch of the National Tele-Mental Health service, 42 Tele-Manas cells have been established that has already recorded over 2 lakh calls".

4th ECSWG & Environment & Climate Ministers' meeting begins in Chennai

- The 4th Environment and Climate Sustainability Working Group (ECSWG) and Environment and Climate Ministers meeting began in Chennal today, July 26.
- The three-day meeting brings together around 300 delegates from G20 member countries, invitee countries, and several International Organisations, with a focus on finalising the Ministerial Outcome and the Presidency Documents.
- The 4th ECSWG & Minister's Meeting will focus on three key areas land restoration, circular economy, and blue economy. These topics will take centre stage during the meeting to address environmental and sustainability challenges. On the first day of the event, there will be two parallel sessions -: the Environment Track and the Climate Track. These sessions will delve into different aspects related to environmental and climate issues, with a focus on in-depth discussions about land degradation, biodiversity, and climate change.

BANKING AND ECONOMY

IMF raises India's 2023 GDP growth forecast to 6.1%

- The International Monetary Fund (IMF) on Tuesday revised India's GDP growth forecast to 6.1% for 2023, up from 5.9% projected by the financial institution earlier this year as a result of stronger domestic investment.
- However, the IMF kept the growth forecast for 2024 at 6.3%, the growth rate it had predicted in April. IMF is not the only international financial agency to review the growth forecast for India.



• Earlier in June, Fitch Ratings raised its FY24 (2023-24) growth forecast for the Indian economy to 6.3%, from 6% predicted earlier, citing strong growth in the April-June quarter so far and sustained near-term momentum.

Rajasthan introduces India's first GIG workers bill 2023

- The Rajasthan assembly passed a bill extending social security to gig workers in the state, a first of its kind in the country, without any debate as the House witnessed unruly scenes leading to expulsion of sacked minister Rajendra Gudha and BJP legislator Madan Dilawar for the remainder of the ongoing session.
- The Rajasthan Platform Based Gig Workers (Registration and Welfare) Bill, 2023 seeks to register all gig workers and aggregators in the state, facilitate guarantee of social security to gig workers, and give them an opportunity to air any grievances.
- A vital component of the bill is setting up a welfare board, titled The Rajasthan Platform Based Gig Workers Welfare Board, which will have two members each from gig workers and aggregators to be nominated by the state government besides two civil servants. The board will ensure registration of gig workers and aggregators operating in the state and establish a social security and welfare fund for gig workers. The bill states that the state government will maintain a database of the gig workers and generate a unique ID for every one of them.

Bombay HC directs Goa govt to notify Mhadei Wildlife Sanctuary as tiger reserve

- The Bombay high court at Goa on Monday directed the state government to notify the Mhadei Wildlife Sanctuary and other areas as a tiger reserve under Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 within three months and pulled up the government for continuing "to steadfastly avoid notifying the tiger reserve".
- In its ruling on a petition seeking directions to the state government to notify the sanctuary as a tiger reserve, the high court said that "we cannot allow the tiger, which is a national animal, to fall into a death trap" and ruled that the National Tiger Conservation Authority's repeated recommendations to set up a tiger reserve were not merely recommendations but also directives that would need to be mandatorily complied with.

Arvind Kejriwal inaugurates Delhi's first RO water ATM

- Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal unveiled Delhi's first 'water ATM' aiming to offer
 water access in regions without piped supply and reducing reliance on water tankers.
 These water ATM machines will grant underprivileged sections of the city the same
 quality of RO(Reverse Osmosis) water that has traditionally been available to more
 affluent segments of society.
- The Delhi government aims to address the issue of inadequate piped water supply by installing 500 Reverse Osmosis (RO) plants with integrated "water ATM machines" in



- affected areas. This initiative, led by the Delhi Jal Board, seeks to provide free and safe access to clean drinking water for residents in such regions.
- The placement of these 500 RO plants, each with a capacity of 30,000 liters, will be determined based on the availability of tubewells. The plants will be operated by appointed personnel on government-provided land, while the cost of ₹10 lakh per plant will be covered by the Delhi Jal Board.

SCIENCE & TEHNOLOGY

India to launch 7 Singapore satellites from ISRO's spaceport on July 30

- India would launch PSLV-C56 carrying DS-SAR satellite from Singapore, along with six co-passengers, from the first launchpad of the ISRO's Sriharikota spaceport at 6.30 am on July 30.
- The DS-SAR satellite is developed under a partnership between Singapore's Defence Science and Technology Agency (DSTA) (representing the Government of Singapore) and ST Engineering.
- Once deployed and operational, it will be used to support the satellite imagery requirements of various agencies within the Government of Singapore. ST Engineering will use it for multi-modal and higher responsiveness imagery and geospatial services for their commercial customers.
- DS-SAR carries a Synthetic Aperture Radar (SAR) payload developed by Israel
 Aerospace Industries (IAI). This allows the DS-SAR to provide for all-weather day and
 night coverage, and capable of imaging at one metre resolution at full polarimetry.

SPORTS

Sumit Nagal Wins Tampere Open 2023, His Fourth ATP Challenger Title

- Sumit Nagal clinched ATP Challenger men's singles title after winning the final of Tampere Open 2023 in Finland,. It was the Indian tennis player's fourth ATP Challenger Tour title. Sumit Nagal, 25, won his second ATP Challenger event of the year, defeating Czech Republic's Dalibor Syrcina 6-4, 7-5 in the final.
- Sumit Nagal won the Garden Open in Rome in April, ending a four-year title drought. The Indian tennis player's other two ATP Challenger wins include the Buenos Aires and Bengaluru Challengers in 2019 and 2017, respectively.
- Following April's win at Rome and Sunday's triumph in Tampere, Sumit Nagal also became the first Indian tennis player to win two ATP Challenger titles on European soil.
- Sumit Nagal, who is India's top-ranked men's singles player at world No. 231, made a slow start to the match and was trailing world No. 193 Syrcina 4-1 in the first game.
 The Indian, however, rallied to turn things around to take the first set.

Shubhankar Sharma records best finish by an Indian in The 2023 Open golf Championship

• Shubhankar Sharma achieved a remarkable feat, securing the best result ever by an Indian golfer at the Open At the Royal Liverpool Golf Club in Merseyside, England. He finished in a tied-eighth position alongside Cameron Young from USA. Sharma displayed his skill and determination, carding an impressive 68-71-70-70 to finish just five strokes behind the leaders.



- Shubhankar Sharma's impressive Top-8 performance at the 151st Open marked just the third instance of an Indian golfer securing a top-10 finish in a major tournament. Prior to this, Anirban Lahiri achieved a Top-5 result in 2015, and Jeev Milkha Singh attained a T-9 position at the 2008 PGA Championship in Michigan, USA.
- Jyoti Randhawa previously held the record for the best finish by an Indian golfer at the Open, securing a tied-27th position at Royal Troon in 2004. Anirban Lahiri's tied fifth-place finish at the PGA Championship in Wisconsin, USA in 2015 stands as the finest performance by an Indian in a men's major tournament.

- The Bollywood actor Shah Rukh Khan has been appointed as the brand ambassador of ICC World Cup 2023. Bollywood superstar Shah Rukh Khan launched the World Cup 2023 campaign 'It takes one day' in his iconic voiceover.
- The World Cup 2023 will be held in India from October 5 to November 19, 2023. India will start their world cup campaign against Australia on October 8 and the Rohit Sharma led side will take on Pakistan at the Narendra Modi Stadium in Ahmedabad on October 15.
- The schedule for the ICC World Cup 2023 Schedule has been released by ICC. The 2023 ICC Men's Cricket World Cup will be held in India from October 5 to November 19, 2023. The upcoming World Cup will feature a total of 10 teams.
- India, as the host nation, has secured direct qualification, along with Afghanistan, Australia, England, Bangladesh, New Zealand, Pakistan, and South Africa. These teams earned their spots through their performance in the 2020-2023 ICC Cricket World Cup Super League. The remaining two teams will be determined through the ongoing World Cup Qualifiers taking place in Zimbabwe.

- Approximately 236,000 individuals lose their lives to drowning annually, with children between the ages of five and 14 being more susceptible to this tragedy.
 Research indicates that youngsters and teenagers living in rural areas are at a higher risk of drowning compared to their urban counterparts.
- History World Drowning Prevention Day was established through the U.N. General Assembly Resolution A/RES/75/273 in April 2021, aiming to address global drowning prevention. Drowning, a form of suffocation resulting from the mouth and nose being submerged in water, often occurs in isolation or situations where others are unaware or unable to assist the victim.

Lavasa, India's first private hill station, sold to Darwin Platform Infrastructure

- India's first private hill station Lavasa was sold to Darwin Platform Infrastructure for Rs 1.8 thousand crore after the approval of the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT).
- The resolution plan of Darwin Platform Infrastructure has been accepted by the NCLT and includes payment of Rs 1,814 crore. This payment includes Rs 929 crore to be paid to lenders and Rs 438 crore allocated to provide fully constructed houses to 837 approved home owners.
- The primary objective of Darwin Platform Infrastructure's resolution plan is to address claims of home buyers and ensure delivery of completed homes within five



years, subject to obtaining environment clearance, with a total claim amount of Rs 6,642 crore.

- The resolution plan for Lavasa aims to reduce the concerns and uncertainties that have arisen among various stakeholders associated with the Lavasa project.
- As per the approved resolution plan, home buyers will be required to bear the actual future construction cost payable to Darwin Platform Infrastructure, while ensuring transparency and accountability in the process of receiving fully constructed properties.

Odisha cabinet approves Mission Shakti Scooter Yojana

- Odisha's Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik approved the Mission Shakti Scooter Yojana, a scheme aimed at providing interest subvention on bank loans up to INR 1,00,000 to beneficiaries, enabling them to purchase a scooter.
- This initiative grants affordable access to two-wheelers for Mission Shakti Federation Leaders and CSS (Community Support Staff). It will empower them to fulfill their responsibilities more efficiently, thus increasing their effectiveness and extending their outreach within the community.

Former Australia wicketkeeper Brian Taber passes away a the aged of 83

- Former Australia and New South Wales wicketkeeper Brian Taber has passed away at the age of 83. Taber, who played 16 Test matches for Australia between 1966 and 1970. He made his Test debut against South Africa in Johannesburg where he claimed seven catches and a stumping. He would go on to also face England, India and West Indies during his career. His highest Test score of 48 came against West Indies at Sydney in 1969 in a match Australia won by 382 runs.
- In his domestic career, he played more than 100 games for New South Wales and is a member of the state's Hall of Fame. After finishing playing, he held various roles within the game, including NSW coach and selector and manager of the Australian Under-19 men's team. He was elected to the Cricket NSW Hall of Fame in 2021, and had a reputation as one of the nice guys of Australian cricket. A book about Taber's life was published in 2014, in which former Test captain Brian Booth called him a "wonderful team man".

- Asian Champions Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty defeated world no. 1
 Indonesian duo Fajar Alfian and Muhammad Rian Ardianto in a thrilling 3-game
 men's doubles final 17-21, 21-13, 21-14 to clinch the Korea Open 2023 title in Yeosu,
 Korea on 23rd July 2023.
- The duo entered the summit clash after a thrilling straight-game win over the world number two Chinese pair of Liang Wei Keng and Wang Chang. The world number three Indian pair notched up a 21-15, 24-22 win over the second-seeded Chinese in a 40-minute duel at the Jinnam stadium in Yeosu. It was Satwik and Chirag's first win over the Chinese pair following two earlier defeats. Satwik and Chirag, who has won the Indonesia Super 1000 and Swiss Open Super 500 titles this year will look to add another feather to their already decorated cap with a win in the Korea Open.

Admiral Lisa Franchetti becomes first woman to lead US Navy

She was awarded a Bachelor of Science degree in journalism and earning developmental honors in history. She joined the Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps Programme and was commissioned in 1985. She furthered her education at the Naval War College and obtained a master's degree in organizational management from the University of Phoenix.
